Chairman Fuller requested the committee to work the Senate bills in the grain warehouse package. He opened with SB 2 for discussion and any action. The word "annually" was discussed on Line 21. Rep. Johnson made a conceptual motion to change it back to the original language, delete the word "annually" and change December 1 to December to 31. The motion was seconded by Rep. Lo. The motion was seconded by Rep. Long.

It was brought out that the changed language would mean the same thing. Rep. Hamm made a substitute motion to include "annually" and add after it, "with the close of its fiscal year". The substitute motion was seconded by Rep. Shelor. The substitute motion prevailed and the amendment carried.

Rep. Dempsey moved that SB 2 be passed as amended. The motion was seconded by Rep. Polson and motion carried.

Action was requested on <u>SB 5</u> which deals with prosecuting violations of warehouse law by the attorney general's office.

Rep. Hamm moved to report SB 5 favorably. Rep. Johnson seconded the motion and motion carried.

SB 6 deals with the Kansas State Grain Inspection Director's term of office serving at the pleasure of the governor. Chairman Fuller distributed a proposed amendment to <u>SB 6</u> which is <u>Attachment</u> No. 1.

Rep. Polson moved that the amendment be adopted striking all after the word, "thereto". Rep. Goossen seconded the motion.

Rep. Campbell made a substitute motion to put the amendment in but change the "shall" on second line to "should". The substitute motion was seconded by Rep. Solbach and substitute motion carried.

Rep. Shelor recommended SB 6 for passage as amended. Eckert seconded the motion and motion carried.

SB 3 deals with maintaining the commodity and taking of records, There was discussion on changing Line 136 on Page 4 to change from six months to three months.

Rep. Solbach moved to change the "six months" to "four months". The motion was seconded by Rep. Eckert and the motion for the amendment passed.

Rep. Hamm moved SB 3 favorably as amended. Rep. Polson seconded the motion and motion carried.

The director, upon request of an applicant, may grant a waiver of the requirements of this subsection for a period of not more than 180 90 days if the applicant furnishes evidence of good and substantial reasons for the waiver.

(c)(1) Every applicant for a license to operate one or more public warehouses and every person licensed to operate one or more warehouses shall at all times maintain; in excess of all exemptions and liabilities, total net assets total net worth liable for the payment of any indebtedness arising from the conduct of the warehouse or warehouses equal to at least \$.20 per bushel of the storage capacity of the warehouse or warehouses except: (A) No person shall be granted a license or shall continue to be licensed unless the person has a net worth of at least \$25,000 and (B) any deficiency in net worth required above the \$25,000 minimum may be supplied by an increase in the amount of the applicant's or licenses's bond as provided by K.S.A. 34-229 und amendments thereto.

(2) In determining total net worth: (A) Credit may be given for insurable property such as buildings, machinery, equipment and

prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles

or (2) a report of review conducted by an independent certified public accountant, independent public accountant, or independent management or commission firm, approved to provide financial statements of warehousemen under rules and regulations of the federal commodity credit corporation, in accordance with standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the accountant's certifications, assurances, opinions, comments and notes with respect to the statement.
