Chairperson Harper called the Elections Committee meeting to order. At this time, Clarence Rupp, Manhattan, Kansas, was asked to take the floor to testify on SB 340.

Following a general discussion on SB 340, it was decided to contact the Republican and the Democrat party leaders to give their views on this bill.

Representative Fox made a motion to recommend that SB 340 be tabled at this time. Representative Baker seconded. Motion carried.

Representative Knopp wished to be recorded as voting no on the above motion.

The next order of business on the agenda was SB 339, An Act relating to elections; concerning the filling of certain vacancies in elective offices in cities. Chairperson Harper called on Ernie Mosher, League of Kansas Municipalities, to testify on this bill. Mr. Mosher stated that he was not aware of any need for this bill at the present time, and suggested the Committee schedule another hearing at another time.

Eric Rucker was now called upon by the Chairperson to explain this bill and answer questions from the Committee members.

After a general discussion, it was suggested by Chairperson Harper that Ernie Mosher and Eric Rucker, from the Secretary of State's office get together and work out an amendment to SB 339.

As no one else wished to appear before the Committee on SB 339, the hearing on this bill was closed for today.

SB 376, An Act relating to elections; concerning certain campaign financing and advertising practices; prescribing penalties for the violation thereof, was next on the agenda.

After a short discussion, it was decided by the Committee that SB 376 should be held in the Committee and have another hearing on it.

SB 229, An Act relating to elections; concerning deadlines for filing nomination petitions and declarations of intentions to become candidates, was next on the agenda. Informational material concerning absentee applications and absentee voting in selected counties was handed out to the Committee, as per an earlier request. (Attachment 1)

After a brief discussion, it was moved by Representative Fox to favorably pass out SB 229. Seconded by Representative Acheson. Motion carried.
