Discussion followed on SB 156 (Local residential housing finance law; update to federal requirements). Representative Francisco made the motion, seconded by Representative Nichols to reconsider the action taken by the Committee on March 17 by reinserting lines 168 through 173. Motion carried.

Representative Francisco made the motion, seconded by Representative Nichols, to report SB 156 favorable for passage. <u>Motion carried</u>.

Discussion followed on SB 189 (Title insurance policies; special benefit districts; notice required.). It was the consensus of the Committee to not take action on this bill as HB 2189 deals with the same subject and is on general orders in the Senate chamber.

SB 253 (County commissioners; mileage expenses.) was discussed. The bill will be held at the sponsor's request.

Representative Acheson made the motion, seconded by Representative Wunsch, to report SB 296 (Municipal courts; requiring restitution for violations of municipal ordinances.) favorable for passage. Representative Wunsch made a substitute motion, seconded by Representative Schweiker, to amend SB 296 by inserting in line 49 after the word "restitution" the following "in cases where reparation or restitution is possible." Discussion followed and Representative Schweiker withdrew his second. Representative Schweiker made a substitute motion to table SB 296. Representative Wunsch seconded that motion. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on SB 300 (Issuance of temporary notes or refunding notes to finance local programs.) and the decision was that no action was needed.

Representative Nichols made the motion, seconded by Representative Wunsch to report SB 301 (Self-supported municipal inprovement districts; issuance of bonds of the city.) Representative Francisco made a substitute motion, seconded by Representative Baker, to table SB 301. <u>Motion carried</u>.

Discussion followed on SB 303 (Sheriff; contracts with cities for enforcement of ordinances.). The League of Kansas Municipalities submitted some proposed amendments (See Attachment I). Representative Turnquist made the motion, seconded by Representative Johnson, to amend SB 303 by clarifying as provided by the attachment. Motion carried.

Representative Douville made the motion, seconded by Representative Nichols, to report SB 303 favorably as amended. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on SB 349 (Compensation and expenses of district and deputy district coroners.) Representative Heinemann notified the Chairman he would like favorable action by the Committee as HB 2344 that deals with the same subject is being held in the Senate Local Government Committee.
