The meeting was called to order by Chairman Crowell. The Chairman turned the floor over to Senator Werts who briefed the committee on  $\frac{SB\ 130}{by\ removing}$ . Senator Werts explained  $\frac{SB\ 130}{by\ removing}$  would amend K.S.A. 8-1902 (e) by removing the 50-mile restriction on the transportation of cylindrically shaped bales of hay. It would also amend K.S.A. 8-1902 (f) by restricting the movement of combine headers, loaded side-by-side, to daylight hours only.

Chairman Crowell opened the meeting to committee questions. Rep. Campbell asked Sen. Werts if it was legal to haul the combine headers side-by-side. Sen. Werts replied it was with a special permit.

The next conferee was Ed DeSoignie, Kansas Department of Transportation, who presented testimony before the committee in support of  $\frac{SB}{130}$ . Mr. DeSoignie explained that while the department supported  $\frac{SB}{130}$  and the language restricting combine transports to daylight hours ony was desirable for highway safety, they did have some concerns in regard to safety in the transporation of large round bales. (Attachment 1).

Mike Beam, Kansas Livestock Association, appeared before the committee in support of  $\underline{SB\ 130}$ . Mr. Beam was particularly supportive of the 50-mile radius restriction being lifted.

The Chairman said the committee should be prepared at the next meeting for possible discussion and action on  $\underline{HB\ 2554}$ ,  $\underline{SCR\ 1616}$ ,  $\underline{SB\ 159}$  and  $\underline{SB\ 288}$ . The Chairman also informed the committee a revised agenda would be forthcoming.

The meeting adjourned at 2:15 p.m.

Senate Bill 130

I. Summary of Bill.

Senate Bill 130 amends K.S.A. 8-1902(e) by removing the 50 mile restriction on the transport of cylindrical shaped bales of hay. It further amends 8-1902 by amending paragraph (f) to restrict the movement of combine headers, loaded side-by-side, to daylight hours only.

II. Comments.

Senate Bill 130 is similar to Senate Bill 576 which was approved by the Legislature during the last session. The bill was vetoed by Governor Carlin on May 13, 1982 following the addition of House amendments to the bill allowing annual trip permits.

III. Fiscal Impact.

There would be no fiscal impact on the KDOT over and above the Governor's budget recommendation.

IV. Agency Position.

The KDOT supports Senate Bill 130. Deletion of language restricting the transport of hay bales may not have a significant impact on KDOT; but, we have some concerns of a safety nature. Addition of the proposed language restricting combine transports to daylight hours only is desirable for highway safety.
