MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

SB 2038 - Following Chairman Joseph C. Harder's call to order, he recognized Representative Leroy J. Johnson, who testified on behalf of the bill he had sponsored, HB 2038. (Attachment 1)

Following Representative Johnson's testimony, the Chairman called upon Senator Neil Arasmith who, also, testified on behalf of HB 2038. Senator Arasmith said that the land described in the bill is located in Western Brook County in Palco and that the building on the land was unoccupied. He added that both USD 269, Palco, and the city of Zurich support this transfer.

Following testimony on HB 2038, Senator Allen moved and Senator Warren seconded a motion to recommend HB 2038 favorably for passage, and the motion carried.

HB 238 - The Chairman then called upon Senator Elwaine Pomeroy to testify in support of his bill, SB 238. Senator Pomeroy assured the Committee that the bill would not cost the state any money and explained that the intent of the bill was to remove outdated language. Senator Pomeroy further explained that the bill related to Washburn University only but said that a similar bill relating to community colleges was being considered in the House.

SB 48 - When the Chairman asked the Committee's pleasure regarding SB 48, Senator Rehorn moved to report the bill adversely. This was seconded by Senator Bogina. Senator Angell expressed concern that there did not appear to be enough flexibility in changing boundaries of school districts. However, Mr. Dale Dennis of the State Department of Education, who was in attendance, explained how contiguous districts' boundaries can be changed under the proper conditions. After a call for a vote on Senator Rehorn's motion to report SB 48 adversely, the motion carried.

SB 188 - When the Chairman asked for discussion on SB 188, Senator Kerr expressed his concern by saying the problem was a very serious matter but that there was considerable animosity toward it. In addition to having a logistics problem with the bill, he said that several Committee members have requested additional information on it. Senator Kerr affirmed that

the bill does not favor rural over urban districts or vice versa. Senator Kerr then suggested to the Committee that no action be taken on the bill at this time.

When the Chairman asked for other comments regarding SB 188, Senator Angell suggested that the Chairman write a letter asking for a total list of industrial revenue bonds issued throughout the state.

The Chairman announced that the Committee would hold the bill in Committee if that was agreeable with the members.

SB 238 - When the Chairman asked for action regarding SB 238, Senator Parrish moved and Senator McCray seconded the motion to recommend SB 238 favorably for passage, and the motion carried.

SB 63 - The Chairman requested Mr. Dale Dennis of the State Department of Education to give the Committee an update regarding the outcome of meetings that had taken place regarding SB 63. Mr. Dennis stated that the last meeting had been attended by Senators Hess, Montgomery, Allen and himself, as well as by representatives from the Division of Accounts and Reports. Mr. Dennis reported that at this meeting a compromise was effected regarding the budget forms and that the compromise was satisfactory to the superintendents whom he had contacted. Mr. Dennis stated that he had, also, met with representatives from KNEA, KASB, and USA and that they, too, felt the compromise was satisfactory.

After general agreement by the Committee members, the Chairman announced that SB 63 would be held in Committee.

SB 165 - When the Chairman asked the Committee if it wanted to take action on SB 165, which is similar to SB 48, Senator Bogina moved that the bill be reported adversely. Senator Rehorn seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

SB 260 - When the Chairman called for the Committee's pleasure on SB 260, Senator Kerr moved that SB 260 be recommended favorably for passage. This was seconded by Senator Rehorn. Although the Chairman announced that the motion had carried, the call for a division indicated 4 yeas and 5 nays. During Committee discussion, Senator Rehorn said he felt the bill was needed so that the money already spent on competency testing will not have been wasted. He, also, said he believed that competency testing has helped to develop an awareness of performance. Senator Angell then moved that SB 260 be reported adversely, and this motion was seconded by Senator Parrish. When the Chairman announced that this motion did not carry, a division of votes indicated 3 yeas and 5 nays. The Chairman ruled that the motion did not carry and that the bill will be held in Committee. Senators Rehorn and Winter requested that their aye votes to report SB 260 favorably for passage be recorded in the minutes. Senator Rehorn also requested that his nay vote to report SB 260 adversely be recorded.

The Chairman announced that a hearing on HB 2175, School Finance, will be held on Monday, February 28, and he distributed computer printouts and accompanying explanations of the bill (Attachments 2, 3, and 4) to Committee members in preparation for the hearing.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 2:30 p.m.



LISTING OF REASONS WHY 1983 ESTIMATED TAX RATES
ON SCHOOL FINANCE COMPUTER PRINTOUTS MUST BE
CONSIDERED WITH EXTREME CAUTION

1. All tax rate calculations for the 1983-84 school year are based on 1982 assessed valuations — the most recent available data. Actual tax levies for 1983-84 will be based on 1983 assessments (which no longer include farm machinery).
2. The calculations shown on the computer printouts are, for convenience sake, based upon a 12-month budget. In fact, school district budgets are computed upon an actual 18-month budget cycle.
3. Calculations are based on the assumption that school districts will use their entire budget authority under the law. This does not always occur. Underspending of the budget results in cash carryover amounts which can be used to reduce the general fund property tax rate required to fund the budget in the next school year.
4. Budgets and tax levies are computed on the basis of estimates of enrollment, as well as other estimates, e.g., taxable income, income tax rebate, etc. These estimates influence the computation of estimated 1983 tax rates.
5. There is a tendency to compare the estimated 1983 general fund tax rate with the actual 1982 general fund tax rate. In some cases, the 1982 figure is not truly reflective of what the actual tax rate of a school district would have been if the district had not taken certain actions. For instance, the 1982 general fund tax rate might reflect overestimates or underestimates of state aid entitlements.
6. Many school districts will have less money to carryover from 1982-83 to 1983-84 than they had anticipated due to the \$16.1 million reduction in general state aid in 1982-83. As a consequence, some of the 1983 rates could be higher than shown on the printout.
