Senator Gaar opened the hearing on S.B. 256, which would authorize submission of a proposal to the voters of Sedgwick County to provide for a part-time board of county commissioners. Senator Francisco, Mr. Roger Grund and Ms. Beth Sharpstein addressed the committee in support of the legislation. Mr. Kim Dewey, on behalf of the Sedgwick County Commissioners, appeared as an opponent of the bill. Senator Gaar asked Senator Daniels to review the bill and make recommendations to the committee.

Mr. Chris McKenzie spoke in support of S.B. 300, directing the method of issuance and sale of temporary notes when dealing with a governmental agency. Senator Mulich moved to report the bill favorably for passage. Senator Daniels seconded the motion, and it carried by unanimous vote. Senator Montgomery was appointed to carry the bill.

Mr. Chris McKenzie asked the committee's consideration of proposed amendments to S.B. 303, concerning interlocal governmental contracts for law enforcement services. Senator Gaar asked Ms. Kiernan to contact the Attorney General's office for input.

Senator Gaar distributed proposed amendments to S.B. 375, concerning allocation of the issuance of single family mortgage revenue bonds in Kansas. Senator Mulich moved adoption of the amendements. Senator Daniels seconded the motion, and it carried by unanimous vote. Senator Mulich moved, and Senator Winter seconded, to report the bill as amended favorably for passage. The Senator Gaar indicated he will carry the bill. The motion carried.

Senator Winter moved to amend S.B. 301, authorizing issuance of bonds by self-supported municipal district, as set out on Attachment I. Senator Mulich seconded the motion and it carried by unanimous vote. Senator Winter then moved to report the bill favorably for passage. Senator Mulich seconded the motion, and it carried unani-Senator Winter was appointed to carry the bill.

Senator Gaar asked the committee's consideration of S.B. 298, which would clear up statutory conflicts concerning notice of election for issuance of bonds. Senator Mulich moved, and Senator Ehrlich seconded, to report the bill favorably. The motion carried, and Senator Montgomery was assigned to carry the bill.

Senator Daniels moved to approve the minutes of the March 3, 1983 Senator Mulich seconded the motion and it carried. meeting.

The meeting was adjourned to March 8, 1983.
