Senator Gaar opened the hearing on $\underline{\text{H.B. }2438}$, which would strike the requirement to publish the address of property subject to sale for nonpayment of taxes and the requirement to publish the breakdown by subdivision of delinquent taxes. Proponents of the bill included Representative Dillon, Ms. McBride, Mr. Allen and Ms. Ladesic. Bland spoke in opposition to the bill.

Senator Mulich seconded the motion. Senator Montgomery offered a substitute motion to localize the bill to be applicable to Sedgwick County. Senator Allen seconded the substitute motion, and it carried. Senator Daniels reoffered her above motion. Senator Bogina seconded the motion, and it carried. Senator Daniels moved to report the bill favorably as amended for passage. Senator Ehrlich seconded the motion, and it carried by a vote of 5-1. Senator Daniels was appointed to carry the bill.
