Senator Hess reminded the committee that a motion was on the table from the last meeting to apply regular sales tax to gross receipts on all sales at private clubs.

There was an extended discussion concerning the amount of money which would be forthcoming if the motion passed; and further discussion concerning recommendations by the Governor for additional needed revenue. During the discussion, Senator Bogina expressed concern that the proposed distribution formula in SB 429 would reduce distribution to some counties.

Senators Steineger and Hein said they would like to look at the entire picture on liquor tax, including the Governor's recommendation for gallonage tax (SB 443), before making a decision on SB 429.

Senator Bogina withdrew his motion from the April 5 meeting.

Motion was made by Senator Steineger to strike 3.2% beer from SB 429. The motion lost for lack of a second.

Motion was made by Senator Talkington and seconded by Senator Gaines to reinsert Section 2, and change 10% to 15%, plus necessary technical amendments to Sub. for SB 429. The motion carried by voice vote.

Motion was made by Senator Gaines and seconded by Senator Talkington to report Sub. for SB 429 as amended favorably for passage.

A substitute motion was made by Senator Steineger to hold Sub. for SB 429 in the committee and act on it after hearings and action on SB 443. The motion lost for lack of a second.

The original motion by Senator Gaines carried by roll call vote.

The meeting was adjourned by the Chairman.
