The Senate Ways and Means Committee has adopted a motion directing me to request the Legislative Coordinating Council to designate a special committee to study the possibility of expanding coverage of the KP&F retirement system to include additional employee classes.

Bills were introduced during the 1983 Session of the Legislature to provide inclusion in KP&F of alcoholic beverage control enforcement officers (SB 158); emergency medical technicians (SB 242); and state game protectors under the Kansas Fish and Game Commission (HB 2272). It is noted that other employee classes have been considered for inclusion in KP&F or special provisions similar to those for correctional employees (involving the dates for normal and early retirement and KP&F disability coverage). In addition to those mentioned, such classes have included:

Capitol Area Security Patrol officers and communications operators in the Highway Patrol, security personnel for Schools for the Deaf and Visually Handicapped, park managers and patrol officers under the State Park and Resources Authority, security personnel at institutions under the State Board of Regents, instructional staff of KU's Fire Service Training Program and Law Enforcement Training Center, security personnel at institutions under the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, personnel of Legal Services for Prisoners, and securities investigator/auditors in the Office of the Securities Commissioner.

It is suggested that the study might involve which agencies should be included in KP&F; what type of provisions should be made for those agencies; and the fiscal impact of including additional agencies.

It is further requested that the special committee make its report and recommendations to the 1984 session of the Legislature.

It is requested that the special committee complete its study and prepare its report and recommendations before the 1984 session of the Legislature convenes.


