The Chairman opened the meeting to committee discussion and possible action on the bills previously heard in committee.

Representative Williams moved to amend HB 3018 which provides for an increase in the check-off limit. (ATTACHMENT I) Representative Miller seconded the motion. The motion to amend carried.

Representative Williams moved to recommend HB 3018 favorably as amended. Representative Miller seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Apt moved to amend HB 3035 which affects the petty cash funds authorized to be maintained by boards of trustees, community colleges. (ATTACHMENT II) Representative Hensley seconded the motion. The motion to amend carried.

Representative Apt moved to report HB 3035 favorably as amended, seconded by Representative Hensley. The motion carried.

Representative Apt moved to amend HB 3067 which establishes a professional standards board and a professional practices commission. The amendment offered is the same as that suggested by Dr. Jerry Schreiner, United School Administrators, (ATTACHMENT III) with the exception of increasing the membership of the board to 18 members including one from independent colleges, and making all the board members voting members. Representative Miller seconded the motion. The motion to amend carried.

Representative Apt moved that HB 3067 be reported favorably as amended. Representative Miller seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Williams moved that HB 3062 be recommended favorably. HB 3062 authorizes boards of education to make payments from the capital outlay fund to sponsoring school districts under cooperative agreements or to boards of directors under interlocal agreements. Representative Polson seconded the motion.

Representative Leach made a substitute motion to amend HB 3062 by engrossing HB 2838 into HB 3062. Representative Hensley seconded the motion.

Representative Lowther called for a ruling from the Chair on whether this could be done. The Chair ruled that the motion was not germain to HB 3062. When Representative Hensley asked if the motion was out of order, the Chair answered "yes".

Representative Hensley made a substitute motion to insert Section 1 of HB 2838 into HB 3062 as Section 2, making Section 2 of HB 3062 Section 3. Representative Brady seconded the motion. After much committee discussion, the substitute motion was lost. A division was called with nine in favor of the motion and nine against.

The question reverted to the original motion to recommend HB 3062 favorably. The motion carried.

Representative Polson moved to recommend HB 2972 favorably. Representative Smith seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Williams moved to amend HB 2844. (ATTACHMENT IV) HB 2844 authorizes

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 72-8505 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-8505. The teaching professional standards board shall have the following responsibilities and duties:

- (a) To develop through the professions of teaching profession and school administration and recommend for adoption, or amendment and adoption, by the state board of education the rules and regulations for professional standards governing teacher and school administrator pretraining selection, teacher and school administrator preparation, admission to and continuance in the practice of teaching and school administration. Nothing herein in this section shall be construed to preclude the state board of education from initiating and adopting rules and regulations on the matters specified in this section, irrespective of any action or lack thereof by the teaching professional standards board. However, in such instance, the proposed rule and regulation governing a matter specified in this subsection (a) shall be submitted to the teaching professional standards board for its recommendation at least thirty (30) 30 days prior to a motion for adoption by the state board of education. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this subsection (a), if the state board of education finds that an emergency exists, it may immediately adopt any rule and regulation rules and regulations without such submission to the teaching professional standards board and without such a waiting period.
- (b) To confer on a professional advisory basis with the state board of education on all other matters concerning education and the teaching profession professions of teaching and school administration.
- (c) To make recommendations to the state board of education, state board of regents, institutions of higher education postsecondary education, local boards of education, the legislature, state officials, and other individuals or groups regarding matters to improve education.
- (d) To develop advisory guidelines with respect to profesone sional employment practices and recommend to the state board of education for adoption thereby a code of professional reone sponsibility and competency for teachers and school adminis-
