MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by Representative Don Crumbaker at Chairperson

3:30 AMM/p.m. on March 19 , 1984 in room 526-S of the Capitol.

The Chairman opened the meeting with the hearing for  $\underline{SB\ 391}$  which updates the code standards for school building construction.

Cille King, Kansas State Architecture's Office, testified in support of  $\underline{SB}$  391. She stated that her office highly recommends updating the codes as it is difficutl to deal with the conflicts between the present statutes and the new building codes. She added that the contractors use the most recent codes in building regardless of which department of the State they are working for. Ms King reviewed Keith Blair's testimony from the 1983 session, Mr. Blair is the architect for the Department of Education. He had highly recommended the new codes also, referring to the conflict with counties and cities codes. Ms King did request one update amendment to  $\underline{SB}$  391. That would be to update the national electric code of the national fire protection association from 1981 to 1984. The change in the electrical code is the only change they are requesting.

John Koepke, Kansas Association of School Boards, testified in support of  $\underline{SB~391}$ . He stated that there might be a problem with using the 1984 code conceivably creating a number of problems, similar to when the last change went into effect. It is imperative for the local districts to make reference to specific codes in the letting of their bids and since some are in that process at this time, they would have a number of problems, especially if  $\underline{1984}$  codes were specified. It was pointed out during questioning that the date on line  $\underline{62}$  should be changed to July 1, 1984.

The hearing for  $\underline{SB}$  391 was concluded, the hearing for  $\underline{SB}$  476 was opened.

Ben Barrett, Legislative Research member on staff, briefed the committee on  $\underline{SB\ 476}$  which originally proposed to extend the probation in due process from two years to six years. This bill was a result of the interim study, Re Proposal No. 18. The bill was amended in the Senate, and is now a three year probationary period.

Avis Swartzman, Revisor of Statutes' Office on staff, informed the committee that today the Senate Education Committee took action on <u>HB 2738</u> and amended <u>SB 476</u> into that bill. The action by that committee was as a result of a compromise between Kansas Association of School Boards and Kansas-National Education Association.

John Koepke, Kansas Association of School Baords, testified in support of  $\underline{SB}$  476. He stated that they have long been supporters of an extended probationary period, benefiting both the teachers and the school boards.

Jerry Schreiner, United School Administrators, testified in support of  $\underline{SB~476}$ . He stated that an extension of the probationary period would help develop more effective support methods. He added that they felt a four year period would be better, resulting in a more seasoned staff. Dr. Schreiner also stated that they feel  $\underline{HB~2738}$  and  $\underline{SB~476}$  are two separate issues and should be handled as such. USA is opposed to inclusion of these two issues in the same legislation.

Craig Grant, Kansas-National Education Association, had asked to testify on SB 476, but due to the storm was stranded out of state and would submit written testimony at tomorrow's meeting.
