Hearing on <u>HB 2674</u>: An act concerning public utilities; relating to electric transmission lines; amending K.S.A. 66-1,178 and repealing the existing section.

Mr. Brian Moline, Kansas Corporation Commission, appeared in support of HB 2674. Mr. Moline stated it was rather a 'simple' bill with one suggested change in line 35 by inserting "necessity for and the". Mr. Moline cited the history and said that the 1979 Legislature passed the Kansas Transmission Lines Citing Act. The measure was passed because of a perception that people did not want transmission lines on property, and particularly proceedings of eminent domain. A brief question and answer period followed Mr. Moline's presentation.

Representative Fox moved to report HB 2674 favorable for passage. Representative Charlton seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Final Action on bills previously heard. The Chairman reminded committee members that discussion and possible final action would begin tomorrow on HB 2740.

HB 2628 - An act concerning hazardous wastes; requiring notification of groundwater contamination relating to the operation of a hazardous waste disposal facility.

Representative Keith Roe moved to recommend HB 2628 favorable for passage. Representative Acheson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

HB 2727 - An act concerning water supply systems and wastewater treatment facilities; relating to certain fees; amending K.S.A. 65-4506 and repealing the existing sections.

Representative Walker moved to recommend HB 2727 favorable for passage. Representative Grotewiel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

HB 2728 - An act concerning water polution control; relating to fees for permits issued by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Environment; amending K.S.A. 65-166a and repealing the existing sections.

Representative Farrar expressed concern over the five year term of the bill. He stated there was nothing to preclude fees raising considerably during the five year period. Representative Farrar asked to have an amendment drafted to place a limitation on the fee schedule. Several committee members expressed Rep. Farrar's concern and the bill was tabled until an amendment can be drafted to address the problem. Discussion ended on \underline{HB} $\underline{2728}$.

HB 2760 - An act concerning the nuclear energy development and radiation control act; amending K.S.A. 48-1601, 48-1603, 48-1604, 48-1607, 48-1608, 48-1609, 48-1610, 48-1611, 48-1612, 48-1613, and 48-1615 and repealing the existing sections.

Staff reviewed the bill for the committee and referenced New Section 13 and 15. Representative Fox noted that New Sections 13 and 15 did not deal with high level nuclear wastes; nor could the sections be used to decommission a nuclear power plant. Department of Health and Environment confirmed the notation.

Representative Farrar motioned to amend Section 1, subsection c, as follows: "any state agency or institution acting as a grantee on a federal research or development program which program generates low level radioactive waste within the state shall be required to dispose of such waste in accordance with applicable state law." The motion was seconded by Representative Ott. Motion adopted.

Representative Fox motioned to recommend HB 2760 favorable for passage as amended. Representative Fry seconded the motion. Motion passed.

There being no further business before the committee, the meeting was adjourned at 4:30~p.m.
