The meeting was called to order by the Chairman and he announced there would be no final action on HB 2740 during the meeting.

HB 2123 - An act relating to natural gas; prescribing a maximum price for first sales thereof to agricultural users.

Mr. Bob Anderson, Mid Continent Oil and Gas Association and the Kansas and Nebraska Energy, was the first conferee. Mr. Anderson began by stating he had difficulty agreeing with testimony given yesterday on behalf of Mid Continent since some gas is sold for the life of the fields to purchasers. Mr. Anderson stated, in many cases, the irrigator and royalty owner were trying to benefit from all aspects of the 50¢ gas price. He stated that gas should not be sold for less than the price paid in royalties. Some customers are going to be affected by the irrigators 'cheap' gas. Kansas Nebraska Energy is a utility Company and has been supplying some nongas producer irrigators. As a utility they are regulated by KCC. A brief question and answer period followed his presentation.

Mr. Dick Brewster, Legal Counsel for Amoco, Inc., addressed the committee. Mr. Brewster pointed out that Amoco does not own any pipelines in Kansas. He stated that 95% of the gas is dedicated to Interstate Commerce and contracted for the life of the field to City Services or its successors. Mr. Brewster said Amoco has no problem with HB 2641, Section 8, that it did not apply to interstate. He stated they have never refused to sell to irrigators. Mr. Brewster went on to say that HB 2123 does not mandate sale at a price and that the real problem with the irrigator/royalty owner was that they were not willing to accept the loss of royalty when paying lower prices on gas. A brief question and answer period followed Mr. Brewster's presentation. Several questions centered around the long term availability of gas.

The next item on the agenda was HB 2740. Committee discussion of proposed amendments. Barbara Sabol, Secretary, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, distributed at list of proposed amendments explaining codes contained therein. (A=EPA recommendations; B= Radioactive; C=Kansas Department of Health and Environment Recommendations; and D=Kansas Department of Health and Environment and EPA Recommendations. Ms. Sabol reviewed each one for the committee (See Attachment 1).
