A special meeting of the House Energy and Natural Resources Committee was held to take final action on bills in committee.

HB 2123 - An act relating to natural gas; prescribing a maximum price for first sales thereof to agricultural users.

Represensentative Farrar motioned to adopt amendments outlined in Attachment 1. Representative Sughrue seconded the motion. Motion adopted. Representative Farrar moved to recommend HB 2123 favorable for passage as amended. Representative Rosenau seconded the motion. Motion carried.

 $\frac{\rm HB~2724}{\rm cm}$ - An act concerning fish and game; relating to hunting license; amending K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 32-401 and 32-405 and repealing the existing sections.

Representative Barr explained testimony provided during a subcommittee hearing in support of retaining the hunter safety program and mandating that persons applying for hunting licenses must have taken the course and carry the prescribed card designating they had attended the hunter safety program. Representative Barr distributed a proposed amendment and moved that it be adopted. Representative Acheson seconded the motion. (Attachment 2). Motion adopted. Representative Barr moved to report HB 2724 favorable for passage as amended. Representative Acheson seconded the motion. Motion adopted.

 $\frac{\mathrm{HB}\ 2771}{\mathrm{apparel}}$ - An act concerning fish and game; requiring certain safety

Representative Fox briefed the committee on the subcommittee hearing and stated the subcommittee had not arrived at a recommendation for the bill.

Representative Fox moved to delete the words "red or" in lines 0022 and 0023, and inserting after color on line 0022 the words "or is wearing". Representative Webb seconded the motion. Motion adopted. Representative Fox moved to favorably report HB 2771 as amended. Representative Kent Ott made a substitute motion to table the bill for further study. Representative Walker seconded the motion. Motion carried.

HB 2974 - An act concerning oil and gas; relating to unitization.

The committee requested that \underline{HB} 2974 be recommended for an interim study. The Chairman indicated he would accommodate and request \underline{HB} 2974 be recommended for an interim study.

HB 2624 - An act concerning fish and game; relating to certain fees; amending K.S.A. 1983 Supp. 32-164b and repealing the existing section.

Representative Fox made a motion that HB 2624 be amended on line 51 by striking "20" and inserting "24" and in line 56 by striking "10" and inserting "12". (Attachment 4). Representative Walker seconded the motion. Motion adopted.

Representative Farrar did not feel the fees needed to be increased and made a motion to table the bill. Representative Rosenau seconded the motion. Motion failed on a voice vote.

Representative Fox made a motion to recommend HB 2624 favorable for passage as amended. Representative Runnels seconded the motion. Motion carried.

HB 3069 - An act requiring notice prior to commencement of excavation for the use of explosives; providing penalties for failure to give such notice.

The committee expressed concern that the subject matter involved in $\frac{\text{HB }3069}{\text{recommend HB }3069}$ for an interim study.

Only AN ACT relating to natural gas; prescribing a maximum price for first sales thereof to agricultural users.

0019 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

O020 Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Kansas natural gas 0021 price protection act of 1983."

0022 Sec. 2. For the purposes of this act:

- 0023 (a) "First sale" means a first sale as that term is defined in 15 0024 U.S.C. 3301(21).
 - (b) "Agricultural use" means an agricultural use as that term is defined in 15 U.S.C. 3346.
 - (c) "Natural gas policy act of 1978" means 15 U.S.C. 3301 to 3432, inclusive.
 - Sec. 3. In any case where the purchaser of natural gas in a first sale utilizes that natural gas for an agricultural use, the maximum lawful price per million BTU for each month shall have a base price equal to the contract price, per million BTU for such natural gas applicable on the day before the date of enactment of the natural gas policy act of 1978. In the case of any month thereafter, the maximum lawful price shall be the maximum lawful price per million BTU, prescribed under this subsection, for the preceding month, multiplied by the monthly equivalent of the annual inflation adjustment factor applicable for such month as determined by section 3311 of the natural gas policy act of 1978, and as computed and published by the federal energy regulatory commission.

Sec. 4. Jurisdiction to implement and enforce the provisions

of this act is hereby conferred on the state corporation commission of Kansas. The commission may adopt necessary rules and
