Chairman called meeting to order making reference to the number of bills that will be discussed and possible action taken this date.

Bill Wolff, briefed committee on HCR 5063, and questions to Mr. Wolff and Chairman from committee followed.

HCR 5063

Rep. Williams moved that HCR 5063 be reported out unfavorably, motion seconded by Rep. Green. Discussion. Motion then carried. May it be recorded that Rep. Wagnon and Rep. Branson voted no on this motion.

HCR 5069

Bill Wolff briefed committee on HCR 5069, and discussion and questions followed briefing. Rep. Kline moved that HCR 5069 be passed out of committee favorably, motion seconded by Rep. Williams. Discussion. Question called, vote taken, and motion carried.

HB 2784

HB 2715

Discussion held, then Rep. Walker moved to amend HB 2715 on line 30, by striking "intelligently", and inserting in lieu thereof, "intelligibly". Motion seconded by Rep. Buehler, question called, vote taken, motion carried.

Further discussion in regard to language and content desired in HB 2715.

Rep. Wagnon made a conceptional motion to adopt all encompassing language for clearing up the point on meaning of word "witness". Motion seconded by Rep. Cribbs, motion carried.

Rep. Buehler moved to pass Hb 2715 out of committee favorably as amended, seconded by Rep. Williams. More discussion.

Rep. Blumenthal made a substitute motion to add and or extend language in the bill to encompass the deaf and hearing impaired could participate in jury duty. Motion seconded by Rep. Branson. More discussion.

At this point, Chairman ruled that he would appoint a sub-committee to work with revisor Norm Furse, to clear up specifics in HB 2715, and have them report back to full committee on Monday, February 27, 1984, so that committee may take final action on HB 2715. The conceptional motions previously made will not be amended into the bill automatically, but will be considered by this sub-committee. Sub-committee appointed is, Rep. Walker, Rep. Buehler, Rep. Rep. Walker asked for consenses of committee in regard to jury participation by deaf and hearing impaired. More discussion on this subject. Motion failed to have sub-committee encompass jury duty for deaf and hearing impaired in their amendment consideration for HB 2715.

HB 2893

Discussion, then Rep. Williams moved to amend HB 2893 as; in line 169 to add "funded from user fees", and on line 172, by inserting "funded from user fees". Motion seconded by Rep. Friedeman. Discussion, then the motion carried. Revisor noted there was a technical change needed in title. So agreed. Rep. Williams moved to pass HB 2893 out of committee favorably as amended, motion seconded by Rep. Harder, question called, vote taken, motion carried.

HB 2919

Chairman appointed a sub-committee to work out questions and problems with this bill. Sub-committee appointed was Rep. Hassler, Rep. Long, Rep. Wagnon. Chairman asked that they work out differences and report back to full committee as soon as possible.

HB 2997

Rep. Hassler as chairman of this sub-committee appointed on an earlier date, reported to committee in regard to court docket fee systems. It was decided that the use of term "domestic relations fees", rather than "divorce docket fees", would work much better for the Court Administration. She then spoke for the committee and said they would offer an amendment, (see Attachment No. 3.), for details. This amendment would change the terminology on line 57 to read, "for each domestic relations case for which a docket fee may be charged". Further, in line 68, after the word divorce, add "annulment, separate maintenance or other types of
