HB 2632 - Imposing restrictions on establishment of area vocational schools. Re Proposal No. 36 (Legislative Educational Planning Commission, 1202 Commission)

Ms. Alicia Salisbury of the State Board of Education. Ms. Salisbury said that she would speak to both HB 2631 and HB 2632 in her testimony. She told the Committee that the State Board is supportive of a Type 2 area vocational-technical school for Johnson County. Ms. Salisbury continued by saying that the State Board has reservations and concerns regarding a Type 1 school and then mentioned funding and a moratorium as major concerns. Ms. Salisbury suggested that a provision be made whereby a moratorium would be reviewed in two years. In response to a Committee member's recommendation to have a joint study on the moratorium by the State Board and a Legislative Interim Committee, Ms. Salisbury felt that this would be a good idea and indicated that the State Board would probably be receptive to a joint review.

 $\underline{\text{Dr. Jim Yonally}}$ testified in support of $\underline{\text{HB 2631}}$ but said that he took no position regarding HB 2632.

Ms. Ruth Ann Hackler, who testified in support of HB 2631, pointed out the cost effectiveness that would result through the collective efforts of several districts.

When the Chairman asked the Committee's pleasure regarding HB 2632, <u>Senator An-gell moved</u>, and <u>Senator Rehorn seconded the motion to recommend HB 2632</u> favorably for passage. The motion carried.

Following discussion on HB 2631, <u>Senator Bogina moved and Senator Rehorn</u> seconded the motion to recommend HB 2631 favorably for passage. The motion <u>carried</u>.

Senator Angell then moved that the Committee reconsider its action on HB 2632. This motion was seconded by Senator Winter, and the motion carried.

Senator Angell then moved that the Committee reconsider its action on HB 2631. Senator Eogina seconded this motion, and the motion carried.
