Conferees appearing before the committee:

The Chairman welcomed back the committee members and staff. He said that he felt that the committee is in a good position for the new year, 1984.

The Chairman stated that he had asked Russell Mills to go through the pending committee bills, along with Fred Carman's assistance, to brief the committee.

The following bills were discussed.

SB53, by Senator Montgomery, concerning crimes and punishments, unlawful conduct of cock fighting, attending unlawful conduct of cock fighting.

SB76, by Senator Roitz, et al, concerning reducing per diem compensation for legislators.

SB98, by Senator Francisco, concerning place of conducting bingo games.

Senator Winter said that the special committee on bingo had worked with the Revenue Department to lessen the additional staff they would have to have to make this enforceable.....Senator Vidricksen would like to have comparison of revenues from June through December 1982, and June through December 1983......

Senator Meyers would like to have a report from the Attorney General to see if any of the concerns expressed last year are still there......With the permission of the committee, Senator Reilly will ask for briefing from Revenue Department and Attorney General's office.

SB99, by Senator Francisco, concerning payment of bingo cash prize by check.

SB304, by Federal and State Affairs, making service of court process. Staff will check on this to see if there is a similar bill.

SB325, by Federal and State Affairs, concerning residence requirements for private club licensees. Senator Reilly will ask Alcoholic Beverage Control and private club people to appear.

SB326, by Federal and State Affairs, concerning Class A private club license increase. Would raise the license fee of private club from \$250 to \$500.

SB403, by Federal and State Affairs, amendments to the prohibition on pit dog fighting. It was the consensus of the committee for the Chairman to have persons appear to testify on the issue.

SB405, by Federal and State Affairs, concerning private club membership for military personnel on temporary duty. Senator Wertz has other bills to introduce on the subject.

HB2330 by Representative Duncan, concerning classes of people not eligible to receive license under Kansas liquor control act. Amended into Sub.HB2551.

Senator Pomeroy moved that HB2330 be reported unfavorably.

2d by Senator Morris. Motion carried.
