The meeting was called to order by Senator Talkington, Chairman, to discuss Substitute for Senate Bill No. 489 which, if passed, would transfer the power to suspend drivers' licenses from the courts to the Department of Revenue.

SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 489 - ACTION

Referring to Line 95 on Page 2, Senator Norvell asked the Committee to consider changing 10 days for each point assessed to 5 days in suspending a person's driver's license and driving privileges to address the problem of driving under the influence for first offense which would modify the 100 day suspension in the proposal to a 50 day suspension. He indicated the amendment would encourage drivers to obey shorter suspensions recommended by driver authorities and the 50 day suspensions are in line with the federal guideline recommendation for suspensions of 30 days.

Senator Norvell moved to change 10 days to 5 days in Line 95 on Page 2; seconded by Senator Hayden. The motion carried.

Senator Norvell moved for suspension of a driver's license for one year upon second conviction; seconded by Senator Johnston. The motion carried.

Senator Hein moved for an amendment specifying that suspension of drivers' licenses will be conducted by the Department of Revenue with no allowance to judges for flexibility in making suspensions lower than the Department's assigned points;
