MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by Representative Don Crumbaker at

3:30 p.m. on February 18, 1985 in room 519-S of the Capitol.

Conferees appearing before the committee:

The Chairman opened the meeting by requesting the Committee members review SB 124 pertaining to the State Advisory Council for Vocational Education. He stated that if the Committee did not object, there would be no hearing on this bill and possibly it could be voted to be put on the Consent Calendar as this is a clean-up bill needed in a timely fashion.

The Committee was presented with a copy of a letter, by request of Representative William Bryant, concerning HB 2118 which addresses the teacher's supplemental contracts.

The Committee was given copies of the fiscal note for HB 2144, the topic of today's staff briefing. (ATTACHMENT 2)

The staff briefed the Committee on school finance which included HB 2144, the Governor's proposal for school finance.

Ben Barrett, Legislative Research Department, described the formula for the school district equalization act (SDEA). (ATTACHMENT 3)

Dale Dennis, State Department of Education, described how the formula works by using an example. (ATTACHMENTS 4 & 5)

Ben Barrett briefed the Committee on how SDEA has progressed since the 1972-73 school year. (ATTACHMENT 6) He also presented the Committee with a summary of the funding history, both estimated and actual. (ATTACHMENT 7)

Dale Dennis supplied the Committee with copies of a printout using the provisions included in HB 2144 with a budget authority of 6% - 12%. (ATTACHMENT 8) Mr. Dennis also presented a printout with the proposed 5% - 15% budget authority which is what the limitations would revert to if no action were to be taken. (ATTACHMENT 9)

Mr. Barrett and Mr. Dennis had prepared a comparison of various budget authority spreads for the Committee's information and referral. (ATTACHMENT 10)

Representative Leach made a motion to have a computer run done with a budget authority of 5% - 10%. Representative Branson seconded the motion. The motion failed.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:19 p.m.

The next meeting of the Committee will be February 19, 1985 at 3:30 p.m. in Room 519-S.

Dear Bill:

I am writing to you to express my concern about House Bill No. 2118. As you know, I have represented U.S.D. No. 222 for over ten years and U.S.D. No. 455 for several years. In my capacity of representing these school districts, I have been chief negotiator at negotiations and have developed a close relationship with the school districts in regard to all school matters. Over the past few years, there have been several occasions in U.S.D. No. 222 where the coach has resigned as coach and continued to be employed as a teacher. These situations have caused some problems, but have always been worked out. In discussing this type of situation with Dr. Baskerville, Superintendent at U.S.D. No. 222, he feels he can always work out the problem caused by a teacher terminating his supplemental contract. Granted, House Bill No. 2118 will give the district another option-terminate the primary contract. However, what about the future? I can't imagine that teachers are going to sit idly by on this issue. If a supplemental contract is so important that its performance affects a teacher's employment, then shouldn't the supplemental contract be subject to tenure and due process? This does not appear to me to be an unreasonable argument, and I think it will probably be presented to the legislature in the near future if House Bill No. 2118 is passed.

I was recently at a negotiations seminar and spoke with several superintendents. I found none and I would guess that there are very few who given the choice of continuing under the status quo or having House Bill No. 2118 adopted together with tenure and due process applied to supplemental contracts would not choose the status quo. I realize that House Bill No. 2118 does not give tenure and due process to supplemental contracts, but as stated above, it seems very likely that a great effort would be made by the teachers to have the law changed in the near future. Frankly, it seems to me they have

a reasonable argument. If as a teacher I don't want to be assistant junior high football coach any longer, that gives the Board the right to terminate my primary contract, maybe I should have some rights in regard to the District terminating my position as assistant coach. Further, House Bill No. 2188 provides that the teacher's primary contract may be nonrenewed on the basis of refusal by a teacher to enter into, renew or fulfill the provisions of a supplemental contract. It appears that if the Board demands the sixty year old woman English teacher to enter into a supplemental contract to coach football, either she does or her contract to teach English can be nonrenewed. I just don't believe that if House Bill No. 2118 is passed, there are not going to be changes in regard to tenure and due process applying to supplemental contracts. Basically, it seems to me that we are trying to cure a sore finger with a remedy that is likely to result in the loss of a hand.

I appreciate the opportunity to express my opinion. If you would like to discuss this situation further, I'll be in Topeka on February 18th and could stop by.

SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for House Bill No. 2144 by Committee
on Education

In accordance with K.S.A. 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning House Bill No. 2144 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

House Bill No. 2144 amends state law to implement revisions to the existing School District Equalization Act. The bill would provide for unified school district budget limitations of six to 12 percent for the 1985-1986 school year, authorize school district equalization aid for four year old pre-school exceptional children enrolled in special education services, authorize transfer of school district capital outlay fund interest to the school district general fund, and would eliminate any effect of the so called "Kansas Income Booster Tax" on the determination of taxable income as it applies to provisions of the School District Equalization Act. The bill would implement the recommendations of the Governor as contained in the FY 1986 Governor's Budget Report.

The appropriations which would implement the Governor's recommendation, as contained in this bill, are included in Senate Bill No. 88. The appropriations recommended by the Governor include \$613,760 for a program to provide pre-school education for four year old exceptional children and \$472,649,760 to finance the School District Equalization Act.

As a consequence, distributions of this tax were greater in 1982 than would otherwise have occurred.

Note: The transportation aid program also is a part of the School District Equalization Act. The Governor has recommended full funding of that formula for FY 1986 — \$42.8 million. This is an increase of \$2.6 million over FY 1985. Also, it is noted that the state pays the employer contribution to the Kansas Public Employees Retirement System on behalf of school districts, community colleges, and area vocational-technical schools. The Governor estimates that the FY 1986 contribution will be \$43.8 million, up \$2.6 million over FY 1985. This estimate is based on school district budget controls of 106 percent to 112 percent for 1985-86. This figure will be adjusted to reflect whatever budget controls finally are approved.

- * Teachers salaries will vary significantly from district to district. As the property tax mill rate increases, school districts tend to be less inclined to use their full budget authority. Estimates assume state aid at the 95 percent level for the excess costs of special education.
- ** Governor's proposal includes deposit of interest on the capital outlay fund to the general fund of the district -- 1985-86 only.
- a) General state aid and income tax rebate (combined).
- b) Aid ratio computation does not include \$4,586,000 in interest transferred from the capital outlay fund to the school district general fund in 1984-85. Thus, for purposes of this computation, the school district general fund budget totaled \$1,124,854,000.
