Chairperson Harper called the meeting to order and announced that Substitute SB 135 was the first order of business for today. The Chairperson called the attention of the committee to an amendment which was being offered simply as a clean-up to correct a bill drafting error. (Attachment 1).

Representative Guldner made a motion to adopt the proposed amendment. This motion received a second by Representative Crumbaker. Motion carried.

Representative Justice was now recognized by the Chairperson, and he called attention to the balloon copies of several proposed amendments on SB 135. and told the committee he preferred the amendment where the wording on line 22 "in any newspaper, magazine or other periodical" would be deleted and "for political advertising" would be inserted. (Attachments 2 & 3).

Following discussion, Representative Justice made a motion to adopt the amendment "for political advertising". Seconded by Representative Charlton. By a division vote the motion failed. 5 in favor, and 7 opposed.

Representative Blumenthal made a motion to report Sub SB 135, as amended, out of committee favorably. Representative Crumbaker seconded this motion. Motion carried.

Representative Justice is recorded as voting "no" on the above motion.

SB 200, which is a bill concerning tie votes, was the next order of business for discussion and possible action.

Representative Blumenthal moved to table SB 200. Seconded by Representative Guldner. Motion carried.

Representative Baker is recorded as voting "no" on the tabling of SB 200.

HB 2537, concerning certain campaign contributions and expenditures, was next on the agenda for consideration. Chairperson Harper told the committee that this bill was rereferred back to the Election Committee from Ways & Means.

A proposed amendment on HB 2537 was passed out to committee members. This amendment was requested by Jim Edwards, Kansas Assocation of Commerce & Industry. At this time, Mr. Edwards came before the committee and gave them a briefing of the amendment. (Attachment 4).

Representative Justice moved to adopt the proposed amendment on HB 2537. Seconded by Representative Guldner. Motion carried.

Tom Whitaker stood for questions from the committee at this time. Following a discussion period, Representative Crumbaker moved to report HB 2537, as amended, out of committee favorably. Seconded by Representative Knopp. Motion carried.
