Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Ron Fox called on Representative Mollenkamp for a report from the subcommittee which had been appointed to study <u>House Bill 2256</u>, which would establish a groundwater regulation advisory committee. Representative Mollenkamp noted changes made in the balloon copy on lines 30 and 41. (<u>Attachment 1</u>) During discussion, Representative Spaniol commented that this bill would require a fiscal note to fund the advisory board, staff, etc. He thought this could be handled by Rules and Regulations. Representative Mollenkamp commented on the letter signed by the subcommittee members which recommended an interim study of this problem and which might also review the compliance and enforcement of <u>Senate Bill 498</u>. (<u>Attachment 2</u>)

Representative Ott gave the Natural Resources Subcommittee report. He noted that the following bills were recommended to be passed favorably:

- 1. House Bill 2307, which would allow the Fish and Game Commission to issue 24 hour fishing licenses. He said there were no opponents to this bill.
- 2. House Bill 2255, sponsored by Representative Guldner, relating to vendor's fee for issuance of nonresident fishing and hunting licenses. This bill would double the fee from 25¢ to 50¢. Copies of an amendment to this bill were distributed to the committee. (Attachment 3)

Representative Patterson gave the report of the Energy Subcommittee. Regarding <u>House Bill 2037</u>, pertaining to city-owned natural gas production well exempt from regulation, he noted that it had been previously reported that this bill was tabled until an application had been made to the Kansas Corporation Commission and the committee had accepted this. Other bills heard by this committee were:

House Bill 2041 -- Establishing Kansas coal commission. The committee had asked to hold this until another bill was received and this had not yet arrived.

House Bill 2100 -- Public utilities; essential use rates.

<u>House Bill 2176</u>--Public utilities relating to the powers of the Kansas Corporation Commission.

House Bill 2277 -- Compensation for person intervening in corporation commission proceedings.

Chairman Fox announced that <u>House Bill 254l</u>, pertaining to harassment of persons while hunting, fishing or trapping, had been scheduled for hearing on Wednesday, March 6, but the person requesting the bill was not ready and desired to have it passed over, so it would not be heard until next year. He commented that unless the committee desired to take action on the bills being heard on Wednesday, March 6, action would not be taken until Thursday, March 7, when action would be taken on all bills heard. It was also announced that <u>House Bill 2336</u>—Division of energy and energy advisory committee established, sponsored by Representative Heinemann, would be heard on Thursday, March 7, and this would be noted on a revised agenda.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 p.m.

OO18 establishing an advisory committee on regulation of groundoo19 water activities.

0020 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the advisory com-0022 mittee on regulation of groundwater activities to be composed of 0023 10 members as follows: The secretary of the department of 0024 health and environment or the secretary's designee who shall be 0025 the chairperson of the committee; four water well contractors 0026 who shall be appointed by the governor from recommendations 0027 submitted by the Kansas water well association; a toxicologist or 0028 public health official who is on the staff of the university of 0029 Kansas medical center or one of the state universities who also 0030 shall be appointed by the governor; one member who shall be appointed by the chief engineer of the division of water resources; one member who shall be appointed by the chairperson of the corporation commission; one member who shall be appointed by the state geologist, and one member who shall be appointed by the water systems council. The committee shall meet at least once each quarter calendar year and upon the call of 0037 the chairperson. The committee shall review and make recom-0038 mendations on groundwater activities, including but not limited 0039 to licensing, setting of fees, establishing well standards, 0040 promulgating rules and regulations and all other matters per-0041 taining to the protection of groundwater of the state.

2 (b) Prior to adopting any rules and regulations concerning ...043 groundwater exploration and protection, the secretary of the 0044 department of health and environment shall submit the proposed 0045 rules and regulations to the advisory committee for review

one member who shall be appointed by the governor from recommendations submitted by the Kansas independent oil and gas association; one member who shall be appointed by the governor and who shall be representative of the manufacturers and suppliers of water well and pump equipment;
