0031	Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitu-

0036	"§ 10. Intoxicating liquors. (a) The legislature may pro-
0037	vide for the prohibition of intoxicating liquors in certain areas.
0038	Subject to the foregoing,

0041	the possession and transportation of intoxicating liquors. The

0043	"(c) The sale of intoxicating liquor by the individual drink

the qualified electors of the county have determined, by a

majority vote of those voting thereon, to permit the sale of

intoxicating liquor by the drink in public places within the boundaries of the county [or in any county in which the qualified electors of the county approve, by a majority vote of those voting on this proposition, to adopt this proposition]." Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with the amendment as a whole:

"Explanatory statement. This proposed amendment would authorize the legislature to permit, license, regulate and tax the sale of intoxicating liquor by the drink in public places in any county where the voters have approved its such sale in their county [or have approved this amendment].

"A vote for the proposed amendment would permit the sale of liquor by the drink in public places in any county where the voters approve its such sale in their county [or approve this amendment].

"A vote against the proposed amendment would continue the current prohibition against the sale of liquor by the drink in public places."

Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the senate and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the house of representatives, shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted to the unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the electors of the state at the special election.
