Chairman called meeting to order, then asked how many members of this committee were considering going to Washington D. C. on Monday and Tuesday next. There are four possibilities.

Chair then directed attention to bill action.

HB 2079:

This legislation would bring the state into compliance with Federal regulations. There was discussion, and Rep. Foster moved that HB 2079 be passed favorably out of committee, seconded by Rep. Hassler. They then withdrew that motion. Rep. Foster moved that HB 2079 be passed favorably out of committee and placed on consent calendar. Motion secondedby Rep. Hassler. There was brief discussion, vote then taken, and motion passed.

HB 2078:

Rep. Friedeman moved that HB 2078 be tabled until April 1, 1985, seconded by Rep. Williams. There was discussion in regard to that being too late to allow the bill to be reported out. Rep. Friedeman and Rep. Williams then withdrew their motion. Rep. Friedeman then moved that HB 2078 be tabled until day certain, March 7th. Motion seconded by Rep. Williams. Discussion again, then vote taken, motion carried. HB 2078 is tabled until March 7, 1985.

HB 2145:

Background given on this bill in regard to language that refers to persons residing, working in, or regularly volunteering in child care homes that have a felony conviction or a conviction of act described in articles 34,35,36 of chapter 21. Lengthy discussion ensued, i.e., liability aspect; definitions on articles 34,35,36; expungement of earlier convictions; true intent of the bill; and on the language "knowingly".

Rep. Branson made a motion to amend HB 2145, by striking in line 26, "felony conviction or has", seconded by Rep. Wagnon.

Rep. Bideau made a substitute motion to insert the word "conviction", add, "for a crime against persons, or a conviction of any action as described in articles 34, 35,36, seconded by Rep. Hassler, vote taken, motion carried.

Chairman than appointed a sub-committee to work further on HB 2145, Rep. Williams as chairman, and Rep. Friedeman and Rep. Green to also serve. Chair asked for a report by February 27th.

Meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.
