The Chairman stated that this meeting had been called for the purpose of reviewing HB2067, concerning cereal malt beverage, and SB187, concerning Class B club authorized to enter into agreement with hotel allowing guest registered at hotel to become temporary member of club. He said there seems to be confusion in the House as to what was the intent of the Senate. HB2067 was in the Conference Committee last week, and the House put a number of provisions into SB187 that were in HB2067. The purpose of this meeting is to reintroduce SB187 without the Sunday sales provision, as well as any other provision the Committee would like to take out, and send it back to the House.

There was Committee discussion on the provisions of SB187.

Senator Morris moved to remove the Sunday sales from the bill, but not to affect the Sunday sales at concerts or conventions; it would limit the beer wholesalers sales of wine to their own franchise brand. 2d by Senator Martin. Motion carried.

Senator Martin moved that this proposed legislation be introduced and move it favorably to the floor. 2d by Senator Anderson. Motion carried.

The Chairman then stated that letters had been written to the Legislative Coordinating Council, at the request of the Committee, for interim study on farm wineries, SB341, and disclosure of vital statistic records, SB319. The Chairman asked if there were other matters the Committee felt should be studied during the interim. Senator Morris made the motion that the Committee recommend a letter to the Legislative Coordinating Council for the study on Kansas parole practices and procedures and for any innovative parole mechanisms used in other states to assist in reducing prison overcrowding. This is to include new areas of restitution and other pertinent procedures. 2d by Senator Martin. Motion carried.
