Conferees appearing before the committee:

ACTION ON S.B. 118 - Lemon Law.

The committee discussed the bill and felt this bill would provide a remedy which is needed in the state of Kansas for consumers. The dealers also want the bill to assist them in getting help from the manufacturers. A motion was made by Sen. Norvell to recommend S.B. 118 favorably for passage. Motion was seconded by Sen. Thiessen.

A substitute motion was made by Sen. Francisco to amend S.B. 118 as recommended by the Kansas Motor Car Dealers Association which would limit this act to the "family car". Motion was seconded by Sen. Walker.

The committee discussed this and Fred Carman said the House had attached eight amendments to their version of the bill and had used the word "primarily" to describe the family car. After some discussion Sen. Francisco withdrew his motion.

The committee returned to the original motion and the motion passed.

ACTION ON S.B. 181 - Concerning tunneling, excavating; notices, damages.

A motion was made by Sen. Walker and seconded by Sen. Walker to recommend S.B. 181 favorably for passage. Motion carried.

ACTION ON S.B. 188 - Motor vehicles; gross weight of vehicles.

There was some discussion as to whether this bill could be amended into S.B. 276 but it was decided it would be better to do the bills individually. A motion was made by Sen. Francisco and seconded by Sen. Martin to recommend S.B. 188 favorably for passage. Motion carried.

ACTION ON S.B. 260 - Financing highways; consolidated highway fund for the city.

The committee had heard no opposition to this bill. A motion was made by Sen. Walker and seconded by Sen. Hoferer to recommend S.B. 260 favorably for passage. Motion carried.

ACTION ON S.B. 221 - Motor vehicles; dealers' limitation on transfer of trade-in vehicles.

A motion was made by Sen. Vidricksen to table S.B. 221. Motion was seconded by Sen. Thiessen. Motion carried.

The committee passed over S.B. 243.

ACTION ON S.B. 246 - Registration of vehicles according to birthdate of owner.

A motion was made by Sen. Walker and seconded by Sen. Martin to table S.B. 246. Motion carried.
