SB 161 - Board of Agriculture

Senator Harder presented the subcommittee report on this department, and committee members were given the opportunity to question him.

SB 87 - Section 2, Board of Agriculture

During Senator Harder's presentation of the subcommittee report on this section, he was asked if the shift of expenditures in subcommittee recommendation No. 5 would place Fee Funds in a precarious position. Staff indicated there is a small balance in each fee fund. Senator Doyen commented that very little of the state's budget is spent on agriculture, and he is concerned about dipping into the Department's fee funds. Senator Harder admitted there is a possibility of some cash flow problems, but his subcommittee felt the balance would be sufficient.

In connection with subcommittee recommendation No. 8, relative to salary payments to retirants for accumulated leave, Senator Harder reminded the committee that this decision was made to correspond to decisions made for other state agencies.

During discussion regarding recommendation No. 21, Senator Harder indicated that legislation is in existence to carry out the recommendation. Senator Kerr said the subcommittee felt that landowners should have the opportunity to pay for at least half of the water rights audits, since this is a property right that is being developed. There were several questions concerning this subject.

SB 87 - Section 3, Animal Health Department

During Senator Harder's report on this section, it was noted that <u>a bill</u> <u>should be introduced</u> in connection with recommendation No. 4; wherein it is recommended that funds be merged and/or eliminated. There were several questions from committee members concerning the subcommittee report.

SB 87 - Section 4, Grain Inspection Department

There were no questions following the subcommittee report on this section.

SB 161 - Board of State Fair Managers

There were no questions following Senator Harder's presentation of the subcommittee report on this section.

SB 87 - Section 5, Board of State Fair Managers

During discussion of the subcommittee report on this section, there were questions concerning the grandstand renovation on the State Fair Grounds.

Motion was made by Senator Harder and seconded by Senator Talkington to delete \$1,100,000 for grandstand renovation, and to amend the subcommittee report accordingly. The motion carried by voice vote.

There was committee discussion about the above motion. Senator Harder indicated that the deletion did not mean that the subcommittee had decided to veto the renovation, but that it was felt there may be a possibility of revenue bonds being issued for that purpose. He further stated that he felt it is a decision which should be discussed and decided upon by the full Ways and Means Committee. Senator Gaines urged that the revenue bond concept be pursued. He said there are special groups renting the buildings on the fair grounds and capital improvements should be paid out of use money. Following a short discussion, it was decided that a decision would be made at a later date.

SB 161 - Kansas Wheat Commission

There were no questions following the presentation of the subcommittee report on this section.

SB 87 - Section 6, Kansas Wheat Commission

There were questions asking for clarification of Recommendation No. 2. These were answered satisfactorily.

SB 161 - State Conservation Commission

Senator Kerr explained the subcommittee report, and committee members were given the opportunity to ask questions.

SB 87 - Section 7, State Conservation Commission

During his explanation of the subcommittee report on this section, Senator Kerr distributed Attachment A, which contains figures concerning the State Water Plan. There was extended discussion concerning this subject; and committee members agreed that the discussion would be continued during deliberations about the State Water Office.

There were questions concerning subcommittee recommendation No. 7, relating to the Water Resources Cost-Share Program.

Motion was made by Senator Doyen and seconded by Senator Johnston to amend the subcommittee report by increasing the watershed dam construction assistance funding by \$200,000. The motion carried by voice vote.

SB 161 - Kansas Water Office

Senator Kerr presented the subcommittee report for this section. There were several questions concerning the report from members of the committee.

Because of the number of questions, Senator Bogina suggested continuing the report at the next meeting of the committee. He then adjourned the meeting.
