The subcommittee report on H.B. 2646 was submitted to the Committee by Representative Clifford Campbell, Representative Don Sallee and Representative Solbach, Attachment I.

Representative Solbach explained the recommendations would change the reporting to the Secretary of the State Board of Agriculture from the County Attorney and that the report be made within 60 days after the date of the discovery of possible pesticide damage. Failure to notify would result in a rebuttable presumption that the damage was not caused by the pesticide application. The Secretary of the State Board of Agriculture would be required to notify the pesticide applicator, The subcommittee also recommended adding language to make it if known. clear that failure to report would not be a violation of the Kansas Pesticide Law and would not preclude civil or criminal action. subcommittee recommended a substitute bill be prepared.

Representative Solbach moved to approve the subcommittee report. Representative Apt seconded the motion. The motion passed.

## SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

REPRESENTATIVES

ON H.B. 2646

Mr. Chairman, your subcommittee on H.B. 2646 makes the following recommendations for legislative policy:

- 1. Require reporting to the Secretary of the State Board of Agriculture within 60 days (note: the 60-day period following application is consistent with the field re-entry and pre-harvest intervals established by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency for most pesticides.) after the date of the discovery of possible pesticide damage.
- 2. Failure to notify will result in a rebuttable presumption that the damage was not caused by the pesticide application.
- 3. The Secretary of the State Board of Agriculture, upon notification of possible pesticide damage, would be required to notify the pesticide applicator involved, if known.
- 4. Add language that makes it clear that failure to report is not a violation of the Kansas Pesticide Law and that failing to report does not preclude the maintenance of any civil or criminal action.

The Committee recommends a substitute bill to accomplish these concepts.
