H.B. 3042-An act concerning the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department, relating to fees for department services

Nancy Kantola distributed a fee schedule for cooperative warehouses,  $\underbrace{\text{Attachment I}}_{\text{wouldn't}}$  Due to the state of the economy she recommended that it wouldn't be in the best interest to increase fees.

Raney Gilliland explained to the Committee the bill lists the annual license fees. The bill states license fees shall not be more than the amounts shown. The department sets the actual amounts charged by rules and regulations. He distributed the license fees promolgated by rules and regulations by the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department, Attachment II, which shows the actual license fees being charged. By changing the rules and regulations additional revenue could be raised.

Sam Reda stated in response to questioning there are 14 full time examiners in the field. There are five full time employees in the warehouse division in the office. They are going to have to employ additional employees due to three examinations in two years.

Staff informed the Committee the Kansas State Grain Inspection Department's ending balance for FY 1985 is \$2,099,000, and the estimated ending balance for FY 1987 is \$1,219,000. The 1987 budget lists 180 employees. The Senate Ways and Means subcommittee did not recommend a fee increase. The subcommittee noted in their report that the balances were declining and urged that expenditures be curbed.

Representative Sallee moved to report H.B. 3042 adversely. Representative Neufeld seconded the motion.

Representative Solbach made a substitute motion to table H.B. 3042. Representative Hamm seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion and possible action on H.B. 3043-Authorizing Director of Kansas State Grain Inspection Department to levy civil fines for violating statutes relating to warehouses and grain storage.

Representative Freeman moved to report H.B. 3043 adversely. Representative Sallee seconded and the motion passed.

The Committee meeting was adjourned at 9:40 a.m.
