Chairperson Harper called the meeting to order and announced that HB 2291, An Act concerning cities; relating to the qualifications of certain city officers, was up today for further discussion and final action. This bill was a request bill by the League of Kansas Municipalities from the 1985 Session of the Legislature. This bill had passed from the committee favorably in 1985, however, with time running short, it was rereferred back to the committee.

Jim Kaup, Staff Attorney, League of Kansas Municipalities was now recognized by Chairperson Harper. Mr. Kaup come before the committee to refresh their memories of HB 2291.

Following a questioning period, Mr. Kaup told the committee he would appreciate their support of this bill.

Representative Crumbaker moved to report HB 2291 favorably. Seconded by Representative Wilbert.

A substitute motion was made by Representative Roy to amend HB 2291 by changing the wording to "date of filing", instead of "date of commencement". Seconded by Representative Charlton. This motion failed by a show-of-hands vote.

Going back to the original motion made by Representative Crumbaker, and seconded by Representative Wilbert, to pass HB 2291 out favorably. The motion carried.

Representative Crumbaker moved to accept the minutes of the March 4, 1986, meeting with a correction being made on the recorded vote of Representative Flottman. The change was from "yes" to "no". Seconded by Representative Kline. Motion carried.
