HB 2898 - An act concerning the code for care of children; relating to reintegration of child into family.

Rep. Jayne Aylward appeared before the committee in support of HB 2989. She introduced Jan Waide of the Department of Social and Rehabilitative Services who also generally spoke in favor of the bill. She expressed SRS' concern with the number "three" in the bill in that if the bill says "three", that the courts will allow a child to be removed and returned to the home three times even in cases where the removal should be permanent after the first removal. Members of the committee inquired if there was statistical data available concerning the number of times children currently are being removed and replaced into families prior to termination. She responded that currently each removal creates a new case, so no data is available.

Kim Brown, a foster parent from Salina appeared before the committee in support of the bill and related some experiences relative to Saline County.
