The meeting was called for the matter of consideration and possible action on SB411, which amends the transient merchants licensing act and relates to exemptions from the application thereof. A copy of the statement of Mr. David H. Moses, Director, Consumer Fraud & Economic Crime Division of the Sedgwick County District Attorney's Office, was distributed to the Committee. It concerns various suggestions he made at the meeting of January 22. There was discussion concerning his statement and whether or not to include it in SB411.

Senator Vidricksen moved to amend SB411 to pick up the language as added to SB412 by the Senate Tax Committee. 2d by Senator Strick. Motion carried.

Senator Daniels moved that the word "pets" be added following the word "to" in line 71, of SB411. 2d by Senator Vidricksen. Motion carried.

The Committee requested that the Minutes show that it is the legislative intent of the Federal and State Affairs Committee that a bowling tournament is an athletic event.

Senator Morris moved that the transient merchants licensing act shall not apply to events sponsored by or held by nonprofit groups. 2d by Senator Daniels. Motion carried.

Mr. Frank Williams appeared as a conferee to express his feelings concerning the Agriculture Committee's power to license exhibits.

Senator Morris moved that the requirement requiring that transient merchants appoint a resident agent be reinserted in the language of SB4ll. 2d by Senator Vidricksen. Motion carried.

The Chairman announced that the Kansas Highway Patrol Superintendent will come before this Committee with proposals tomorrow. The Committee will meet to hear this and any other proposals.

It was the pleasure of the Committee that staff address the concerns in the letter from Mr. Moses, of Sedgwick County, and implement these recommendations in another measure. Staff will prepare a draft.

Senator Arasmith moved that the Minutes of the Meeting of January 23, 1986, be approved. 2d by Senator Morris. Motion carried.
