The Committee held its hearing on Senate Bill 576, which would implement a State Census in Kansas. The Revisor of Statutes, Arden Ensley, explained the bill section by section. After he was finished, Chairman Yost asked if there was anyone who wanted to testify for or against SB 576. No one desired to do so.
