H.B. 2901 - would permit counties to establish enterprise zones. The requirement for the zones would be similar to those for zones established by cities under current law. Presently only cities may designate enterprise zones.

Rep. Moomaw and Rep. Guldner both appeared in support of the bill.

Carol Morgan, Kansas Dept. of Economic Development, spoke in support of H.B. 2901 and presented an amendment. The amendment was requested to clarify the language concerning enterprise zones. (Attachment I)

Chip Wheelan was not present at the meeting but submitted written testimony in support of H.B. 2901. (Attachment II)

Senator Steineger moved to adopt the amendment presented by KDED and to conceptually clean up the language in the bill, and striking all in lines 97, 98 and 99. Senator Allen seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Jamie Schwartz, KDED, expressed support for H.B. 2901. He stated H.B. 3121, which is a companion bill, was voted out of the House Assessment and Taxation Committee. He responded to questions from committee members.

H.B. 2946 - establishes a procedure for the transfer of territory from one cemetery district to another.

Rep. Kent Ott spoke in support of H.B. 2946. He stated the bill was introduced on behalf of the Mulvane Cemetery District which lies in both Sedgwick and Sumner Counties.

S.B. 725 - concerning improvement districts; relating to the organization thereof.

Margaret Conus, President of Lakeside Village Property Owners, spoke in support of S.B. 725. She stated they would like to submit five names to the Jefferson County Commissioners, from that list three names would be selected to serve as directors of the improvement district and reduce the number of qualified electors residing in the improvement district from 100 to 50. She has visited with the County Attorney of Jefferson County and he is in agreement with this change.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO HB 2901
Requested by the Kansas Department of Economic Development

To reinstate the portion of line 102 and all of line 103, currently struck from the bill. Also, to insert after line 131 and after line 168 the language "(5) There may be more than one noncontiguous area within an enterprise zone." Also, to insert on line 150 the language ", including the area or areas which have been designated as an enterprise zone,".

Explanation

The amendment is requested to clarify that more than one area may be contained in an enterprise zone. Currently most cities have multiple areas within one zone. Multiple areas will most surely be necessary in county designated enterprise zones.

An amendment to HB 2901, requested by the Kansas Department of Economic Development, to clarify that multiple areas could be contained in an enterprise zone was adopted by the House Committee on Assessment and Taxation on March 6, 1986. The intention of that action is not reflected in the latest printing of the bill.

Dear Senator Montgomery:

The Kansas Legislative Policy Group wishes to express its support for the provisions of HB 2901.

Our member counties are located in rural, mineral producing areas of the State and our tax base consists primarily of agricultural real estate and minerals. As you are aware, recent market conditions have adversely affected the oil industry. Because mineral properties are appraised using the income approach, we anticipate reduced assessed valuations this year and perhaps into the future.

This means that some of the property tax burden will be shifted to the owners of farm land unless our counties curtail expenditures for important public services. Neither option is desireable.

The creation of enterprise zones might assist county government for purposes of enticing new industry to locate in rural areas and thus expand the property tax base. For this reason, we respectfully urge you to recommend HB 2901 for passage.
