AN ACT repealing K.S.A. 9-1111d and 17-5569, concerning liability of depositor for lost or stolen machine-readable instrument.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 9-1111d and 17-5569 are hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
