Chairman Kline called the meeting to order and opened the hearing on H.B. 2517. Eldon Fastrup of the Board of Agriculture spoke in support of this bill, which was recommended by the Agriculture Task Force of the Legislative Commission on Economic Development. He explained the marketing activities of his department and stated that this bill establishes two fee fund accounts so that money can be received for use of the Kansas trademark and for other market development activities. Rep. Chronister noted that the Appropriations Committee had approved the concept of this bill on March 4. Rep. Dyck moved and Rep. Heinemann seconded to pass the bill favorably. The motion carried.

Chairman Kline told the committee that they would discuss all of the bills on which hearings had been held, beginning with those bills recommended by the Economic Development Commission.

- H.B. 2479. Copies of balloon amendments for this bill were distributed (Attachment 1). Rep. Miller moved and Rep. Aylward seconded to adopt the amendments. Motion carried. Rep. Leach moved that the funding in each category on lines 0014-0015 be divided in half. Rep. Chronister seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Aylward moved to pass the bill favorably, as amended. Rep. Mead seconded. Rep. Chronister moved to insert in the bill that the funding come from the gaming revenue fund rather than the state general fund. The motion was seconded by Dyck. After some discussion, the motion failed. Discussion on the motion to pass the bill as amended continued. Rep. Mead withdrew his second of the motion to pass the bill as amended. Rep. Leach moved to reconsider the previous motion to fund the bill from the gaming fund if funds are available. Motion carried. Rep. Aylward moved the bill be passed as amended. Rep. Dyck seconded. Motion passed.
- H.B. 2434 Rep. Leach moved to amend the bill to change the assessment rate from .04% to .02%. Rep. Heinemann seconded the motion. Rep. Gjerstad made a substitute motion to have the bill held over for study by the Jt. Committee on Economic Development this summer. Rep. Baker seconded and the motion carried.
- $\underline{\text{H.B. }2515}$ Rep. Miller moved, and Rep. Moomaw seconded, to hold the bill for interim study. The motion carried.
- H.B. 2514 Rep. Chronister moved to amend the bill by accepting the balloon(Attachment 2) and making the same changes to the amounts in lines 0100-0104 as in H.B. 2479 by cutting the funds by 50% and funding from gaming revenues if money is available.

 Rep. Aylward seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Aylward moved to pass the bill as amended. Rep. Foster seconded and the motion carried.
- H.B. 2528 Rep. Aylward moved to amend the bill by striking the words "from time to time" in line 39 and inserting the words "review annually" on line 39. She also moved to strike the word "amend" in line 40. Rep. Miller seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Miller moved for a conceptual motion to change the language in the bill

from "program completers" to "people completing program" wherever it occured throughout the bill. Rep. Moomaw seconded and the motion carried. Lynn Holt said there was no fiscal note on this bill. Rep. Mainey moved to pass the bill as amended. Rep. Chronister seconded and the motion carried.

H.B. 2073 Jim Wilson announced that he is still working on the amendment for this bill.

H.B. 2435 Copies of the balloon were distributed (Attachment 3). Rep. Chronister moved to amend the bill to include the balloon. Rep. Heinemann seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Foster moved to pass the bill over for interim study. Rep. Baker seconded, saying that she had asked for an amendment regarding reporting any discretionary actions. Rep. Miller made a substitue motion to report the bill favorably, as amended. Rep. Aylward seconded. Rep. Baker asked if Rep. Miller would accept a friendly amendment to his motion to add a reporting procedure in sections (b) and (c). There were no objections to adding this. On the substitute motion to pass the bill favorably, as amended, the motion carried.

H.B. 2425 Copies of balloon amendments were distributed (Attachment 4). Rep. Heinemann moved that the preamble of the bill be stricken and that the balloon amendments be accepted. Rep. Chronister seconded and the motion carried. It was noted that the fiscal note was \$350,000 as stated at the Board of Agriculture hearing on March 4. Rep. Helgerson moved to amend the bill so that it would be funded from the gaming revunue fund. Rep. Gjerstad seconded the motion. After some discussion, Rep. Helgerson withdrew his motion.

Rep. Miller moved to delete the following: on lines 77-78, remove "as a result of the agricultural economy"; on line 79, delete the word "assist"; on line 87, delete the word "all"; on line 93, delete the word "powers." Rep. Heinemann seconded the motion and it carried.

Rep. Barkis moved to amend the bill by moving it to the Department of Commerce. Rep. Weimer seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Heinemann moved, and Rep. Aylward seconded, to pass it out favorably, as amended. Rep. Leach commented that if the bill were amended to the Department of Commerce, then section (c) needed to be looked at again. He moved to change section (b), line 55, from "state board of agriculture" to "secretary of commerce." Rep. Chronister seconded. Jim Wilson pointed out that references to the Board of Agriculture would be changed throughout the bill to "Secretary of Commerce" since Rep. Barkis' motion had carried. Rep. Leach moved to have the bill's wording remain as in the original balloon except for line 55, which would be changed from "Board of Agriculture" to "Department of Commerce" because this would force the two agencies to work together. Rep. Chronister withdrew her second of the previous motion and there was no new second. Rep. Baker moved for a substitute motion to strike the following: on lines 94-96, the words "all such contracts shall be exempt from the competitive bid requirements of KSA 75-3739 and amendments thereto" and on line 092 the words "negotiated and." Rep. Gjerstad seconded the motion. After further discussion, Rep. Baker withdrew her motion. On the previous motion to pass the bill as amended, the motion carried.

 $\underline{\text{H.B. }2389}$ Chairman Kline announced that proponents had asked that the bill be held over to next year. The committee agreed.

H.B. 2448 Rep. Teagarden moved that lines 90-93 be deleted. Rep. Aylward seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Gjerstad offered a conceptual motion that the following words be added on line 57: "30 days for slaughter of poultry." Rep. Goossen seconded, and the motion carried. Rep. Dyck moved to amend by changing the word "may" to "shall" in line 121. Rep. Hassler seconded and the motion carried. Rep. Chronister moved to pass the bill as amended. Rep. Leach seconded and the motion carried.

Minutes for February 17, 19, 23 and 25 were approved.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30pm.



0017 AN ACT concerning the state board of agriculture; establishing a division of rural initiatives; providing for duties and functions 0018 0019 of such division.

WHEREAS, The state's agricultural economy is experiencing 0020 0021 an alarming rate of farm failures with such failures rippling 0022 through the agricultural economy causing or accelerating the 0023 collapse of associated rural business, the decline and demise of 0024 rural communities and the loss of careers, homes and ways of 0025 life; and

WHEREAS, It is of paramount importance that the state of 0026 0027 Kansas, through the state board of agriculture in cooperation 0028 with Kansas state university, proceed with urgency to become 0029 active in the area of rural social and economic problems in efforts 0030 to revitalize the social and economic base of Kansas upon which 0031 to build for the future; and

WHEREAS, The purpose of this act is to establish a program of 0032 0033 rural initiatives to directly assist rural communities and agribu-0034 sinesses in avoiding and alleviating the problems and financial 0035 distress resulting from or associated with the adverse economic 0036 conditions and forces which are presently experienced in agri-0037 culture: Now, therefore,

0038 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The secretary of the state board of agriculture 0040 with the cooperation of the director of extension of Kansas state 0041 university shall establish a rural initiatives referral program. For 0042 the purposes of providing such assistance and program, the 0043 secretary shall utilize the services of Kansas state university, 0044 other state and federal agencies, county extension personnel, 0045 municipal and community services organizations, personnel and 0046 private business and professional agencies or services available 0047 for such purpose. (b) When assistance is requested by a rural community, all available assistance shall be reviewed and the process of delivors ery shall be facilitated. The assistance to communities shall be conducted within the community by infusion of new ideas and one cross application of known successes.

(c) The secretary is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter most into contracts for the performance of the powers, duties and functions of the program of rural initiatives. All such contracts shall be exempt from the competitive bid requirements of K.S.A. mose 75-3739 and amendments thereto.
