The meeting was called to order by Chairman Miller. New committee members were welcomed and the committee staff was introduced.

Chairman Miller went through a tentative schedule announcing that the lottery would be taken up Wednesday and Thursday and then would be put on hold for a few days. He explained that both the lottery and pari-mutuel should not be rushed through and it is important that we take the time to make sure they are done right. When the lottery is implemented and tickets go on sale, it is a multi-million dollar business from day one. Credibility Credibility is important and one mistake could ruin this credibility.

The death penalty hearings will start next Tuesday, January 20 and the committee will stay on that subject until it is resolved. The committee will than resume discussion of the lottery.

Liquor by the drink and other liquor related bills will start in the Senate and the Chairman encouraged the committee to read the Kansas Liquor Law Review Commission Final Report and Recommendations and also to review HB2043 and HB2044 interim reports which can be found in the Journal of the Senate, January 12, 1987.
