Representative Rolfs made a motion, seconded by Representative Hensley, to approve the minutes of the February 4 meeting. The minutes were approved.

Representative Sprague made a motion, seconded by Representative Eckert, to amend the bill to include language which would permit estate planning by state officers, employees and candidates which would not have to be reported and to strike in (c) (2) "in lieu of an inheritance". The motion carried. See attachment A.

Representative Sprague made a motion, seconded by Representative Roy, to recommend HB2071 favorably as amended. The motion carried.

HOUSE BILL No. 2071

By Committee on Federal and State Affairs

ON ACT relating to state officers and employees and candidates for state office; concerning conflicts of interest; amending K.S.A. 46-229 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 46-229 is hereby amended to read as fol-0022 lows: 46-229. "Substantial interest" means any of the following:

- (a) If an individual or an individual's spouse, either individual's ually or collectively, has owned within the preceding 12 months one a legal or equitable interest exceeding \$5,000 or 5% of any one business, whichever is less, the individual has a substantial one interest in that business.
- (b) If an individual or an individual's spouse, either individuals ually or collectively, has received during the preceding calendar uals year compensation which is or will be required to be included as taxable income on federal income tax returns of the individual and spouse in an aggregate amount of \$2,000 from any business or combination of businesses, the individual has a substantial ual interest in that business or combination of businesses.
- (c) If an individual or an individual's spouse, either individuals ually or collectively, has received directly or indirectly in the preceding 12 months, without reasonable and valuable consideration, goods or services gifts or honoraria having an aggregate value of \$500 or more from any person known to have a special interest other than a spouse or parent, the individual has a substantial interest in that person. If a gift is received for which the value is unknown, the individual has a substantial interest in the donor. A substantial interest does not exist under this subsection if a gift was received as the result of the death of the donor!

by reason of: (1) A gift received as the result of the death of the donor; (2) a gift in lieu of an inheritance from a grandparent, sibling, aunt or uncle; or (3) acting as a trustee of a trust for the benefit of another.
