Representative Ramirez made a motion, seconded by Representative Peterson, to approve the minutes of the February 17 meeting. The motion carried.

The "white paper" on Low-Level Radioactive Waste Management was distributed for the committee to read before the 8:00 meeting on Thursday.

The agenda for the week of February 23 was also distributed.

<u> HB2044 - Pari-mutuel</u>

Representative Aylward made a motion, seconded by Representative Gjerstad to adopt an amendment requiring the racing commission by rules and regulations to establish a schedule of fees for the registration of Kansas-whelped greyhounds; and authorizing the commission to contract with and designate an official registering agency to implement the registration of greyhounds. motion carried. See attachment A with changes.

Mary Torrance explained that interest on any state racing funds will be invested by the Pooled Money Investment Board. If you want the interest to go back into the racing fund, you have to have legislation to that effect.

Representative Long made a motion, seconded by Representative Barr, to add in New Sec. 5 (a)(1) "subject to Senate confirmation". The motion carried.

Representative Barr explained the intent of the sub-committee report which was incorporated in the bill in New Sec. 10(e).

Representative Sprague made a motion, seconded by Representative Ramirez, to delete "with the approval of the commission" in line 378,379 and 383 &384. The motion lost -6-12.

Representative Sprague made a motion, seconded by Representative Walker, to assure that the attorney's salaries are to be paid out of pari-mutuel The motion carried.

Representative Aylward made a motion, seconded by Representative Eckert, to strike on line 315 "Kansas-domiciled stallions". The motion carried.

The Chairman announced that Mr. Tom Kelly of the KBI had brought in some amendments right before the meeting on expungement statutes.

Representative Sebelius made a motion, seconded by Representative Eckert, to create the racing reimbursable expense fund in the state treasury. motion carried. See attachment B.

- New Sec. 22. (a) Any person who claims to be entitled to any part of a parimutuel pool conducted by an organization licensee and who fails to claim the money due such person prior to the 0165 completion of the race meeting at which the pool was formed one may file with the organization licensee within 60 days after the close of the race meeting:
- (1) A verified claim on a form prescribed and furnished by Olos the commission, setting forth such information as necessary to 0170 identify the particular pool and the amount claimed therefrom; 0171 and
- a substantial portion of the parimutuel ticket upon which 0172the claim is based, sufficient to identify: (A) The particular 0174 racetrack, race and horse or greyhound involved; (B) the amount 0175 wagered; and (C) whether the ticket was a win, place or show 0176 ticket.
- (b) Upon proper application by the claimant or by the organization licensee, the commission shall hear any disputed claim 0179 filed in accordance with subsection (a) and shall consider the 0180 proof offered in its support. Unless the claimant satisfactorily 0181 establishes the right to participate in the pool, the claim shall be rejected. If the claim is allowed, the organization licensee shall 0183 pay the amount of the claim to the claimant upon order of the 0184 commission.
- (c) All unclaimed ticket proceeds from parimutuel wagering on horse race meetings shall be remitted by the organization 0187 licensee to the commission on the 61st day after the close of each 0188 race meeting. The commission shall promptly remit any such proceeds received to the state treasurer, who shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury and credit it to the Kansas horse breeding development fund created by section 27.
- (d) All unclaimed ticket proceeds from parimutuel wagering 0193 on greyhound race meetings shall be remitted by the organiza-0194 tion licensee to the commission on the 61st day after the close of

- 0306 (5) moneys for equine research through institutions of higher 0307 education under the state board of regents.
- New Sec. 28. (a) The commission shall, by rules and regula-0309 tions:
- 0310 (1) Qualify stallions for participation in Kansas-registered 0311 stallion awards;
- 0312 (2) provide for the registration of Kansas-domiciled mares, 0313 Kansas-domiciled stallions and Kansas-bred horses; and
- 0314 (3) establish a schedule of fees for the registration of Kansas-0315 domiciled mares, Kansas-domiciled stallions and Kansas-bred 0316 horses sufficient to provide for all expenses incurred in the 117 administration of the Kansas horse breeding development fund 0318 created pursuant to section 27.
- (b) The commission may contract with and designate an 0319 0320 official registering agency to implement the registration of horses and the payment of awards from the Kansas horse breed-0322 ing development fund. Such agency shall operate under the 0323 supervision of the commission and be subject to rules and 0324 regulations of the commission. The official registering agency 0325 shall receive no compensation except fees received for registra-0326 tion of horses necessary to pay its expenses for such registration. New Sec. 29. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the Kansas greyhound breeding development fund to which money shall be credited as provided by this act. Expenditures 1330 from such fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation J331 acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued 0332 pursuant to vouchers approved by the chairperson of the com-0333 mission or a person designated by the chairperson.
- 0334 (b) Moneys credited to the fund shall be expended as fol-0335 lows:

O348 Sec. 30. K.S.A. 21-4302 is hereby amended to read as fol-O349 lows: 21-4302. (1) A "bet" is a bargain in which the parties agree O350 that, dependent upon chance, one stands to win or lose some-O351 thing of value specified in the agreement. A bet does not in-O352 clude:

- (a) Bona fide business transactions which are valid under the law of contracts including but not limited to contracts for the purchase or sale at a future date of securities or other commodities, and agreements to compensation for loss caused by the happening of the chance including, but not limited to contracts of indemnity or guaranty and life or health and accident insur-ones, ance;
- 0360 (b) offers of purses, prizes or premiums to the actual contes-0361 tants in any bona fide contest for the determination of skill, 0362 speed, strength, or endurance or to the bona fide owners of 0363 animals or vehicles entered in such a contest;
- 0364 (c) a lottery as defined in this section;
- o365 (d) any bingo game by or for participants managed, operated o366 or conducted in accordance with the laws of the state of Kansas o367 by an organization licensed by the state of Kansas to manage, d68 operate or conduct games of bingo; or
- 0369 (e) any system of parimutuel wagering managed, operated 0370 and conducted in accordance with the Kansas parimutuel racing 0371 act.
- 0372 (2) A "lottery" is an enterprise wherein for a consideration 0373 the participants are given an opportunity to win a prize, the 0374 award of which is determined by chance.
- 0375 (3) "Consideration" as used in this section means anything 0376 which is a commercial or financial advantage to the promoter or a 0377 disadvantage to any participant.
- Mere registration without purchase of goods or services; per-0379 sonal attendance at places or events, without payment of an

- New Sec. 31. (a) The commission shall, by rules and regulations establish a schedule of fees for the registration of Kansas-whelped greyhounds and Kansas-domiciled greyhounds sufficient to provide for all expenses incurred in the administration of the Kansas greyhound breeding development fund created pursuant to section 29.
- (b) The commission may contract with and designate an official registering agency to implement the registration of greyhounds, and the payment of awards from the Kansas greyhound breeding development fund. Such agency shall operate under the supervision of the commission and be subject to rules and regulations of the commission. The official registering agency shall receive no compensation except fees received for registration of greyhounds necessary to pay its expenses for such registration.
