Representative Martha Jenkins explained the sub-committee report which answered committee questions and incorporated the attorney general's recommendations into the bill. The sub-committee amended the bill to place a time when the candidate shall be fingerprinted and gave the election office the authority to remove the person's name from the ballot if the candidate is found to be unqualified for the office. The cost of the search will be paid by the person being fingerprinted. See attached balloon of the bill. (See Attachment A)

Representative Jenkins made a motion, seconded by Representative Roy, that the subcommittee report be adopted. The motion carried.

Representative Roy made a motion, seconded by Representative Eckert, to report HB2305 favorably as amended. The motion carried.


The Chairman announced several sub-committees to deal with issues in SB141:

AN ACT concerning certain law enforcement officers; relating to qualifications for holding office or for appointment, election or nomination thereto.

Te it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

OO21 Section 1. (a) Before January 1, 1988, each person holding OO22 office as sheriff of any county in this state on the effective date of OO23 this act shall be fingerprinted as provided by this section.

- 0024 (b) Before appointment to or becoming a candidate for the 0025 office of sheriff of any county in this state, a person shall be 0026 fingerprinted as provided by this section.
