The minutes of March 6, 1987 were approved.

Elwaine Pomeroy, Chairman of the Board, Kansas Parole Board Chuck Simmons, Chief Counsel, Department of Corrections

Hearing on S.B. 202-Crimes and punishments, sentencing

Elwaine Pomeroy explained the amendment on line 31 refers to the exceptions to the concurrent sentences, whenever the record is silent as to the manner in which two or more sentences imposed at the same time shall be served. The bill also changes the method of computing the maximum date of the sentence. He proposed the Committee amend the bill by changing the date in line 100 to July 1, 1983.

Chuck Simmons testified in support of S.B. 202. He stated changing the date to July 1, 1983 is appropriate as that was when the computation restriction was imposed. This bill would eliminate any litigation in the future.

Representative Snowbarger moved to amend S.B. 202 by changing the date in line 100 to July 1, 1983. The motion was seconded by Representative Vancrum. The motion passed.

A motion was made by Representative Snowbarger and seconded by Representative Vancrum to report S.B. 202, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion passed.

Hearing on S.B. 203--Sentencing, time served as part of sentence

Elwaine Pomeroy testified this bill amends procedures regarding arrest of parole violators.

Chuck Simmons informed the Committee the Department of Corrections and the Parole Board cooperated in preparing the amendments that are in this bill. He urged the Committee pass this bill.

Representative O'Neal moved to report S.B. 203 favorably for passage. Representative Jenkins seconded and the motion passed.

Hearing on S.B. 279--Crimes and punishments, good tune credits

Elwaine Pomeroy testified the computation of good time credits is very important for inmates as it determines both the parole eligibility date and the conditional release date. The formula for computing good time credits is on page 5 and 6 of this bill.

Chuck Simmons testified the Department of Corrections approved of the formula being included in the statute, but was concerned that adjustments might be made to the formula.
