Marilyn Chapman, Sedgwick County Commissioner, testified before the committee. She stated that she is concerned about the time frame to compliance with HB 2039 in which we are trying to undo years of disorder, and that some of the mechanics may inconvenience many voters. She felt that this bill, as written, could disenfranchise many voters or make going to the polls too inconvenient to bother by restricting changes over a three year period. Several questions concerning proposed changes in the bill were directed to the witness.

Pat McDonald, Shawneee County Clerks Office, expressed concern for functional maps as required in the bill. She stated the the way the bill is worded now, it does not standardize the state in any manner, and will create large, cumbersome, non-reproducible maps. Questions were directed to the witness concerning impact of the bill.

After further testimony from Elgia Stevenson, Johnson County Commissioner, and Jo Ann Mitchell, Shawnee County Commissioner, and committee discussion, the meeting adjourned at 12:15 p.m.
