Wanda Coder, Riley County Clerk, appeared before the committee as a conferee concerning issues involved with military personnel and university students enumerated in a state census. She reported to the committee that 1985 records indicate 18,000 students are attending Kansas State University. 3500 students are living on campus residence halls and 900 live in Jardine Terrace married student housing and this totals one precinct. (Attachments 1, 2, 3)

The 1980 Federal Census figures list 15,192 on the Riley County/Ft. Riley reservation. She stated that she could not get permission from the Federal Government to establish a voting place on Ft. Riley reservation when military personnel were given the opportunity to vote in local elections. (Attachment 4) Ms. Coder covered the fact that voter participation in both of these groups is extremely low and that if these numbers were included in a Representative district that a very low number of voters would decide the outcome of the district election.

Ms. Coder expressed a need for a count of this population for the purposes of determining the need for local service funding separate and apart from reapportionment or election issues.

After questions from the committee members and discussion, the meeting adjourned at 11:45 a.m.



This information comes from different sources such as the admissions process, semester registration, and the personal information and analysis of test scores provided by the American College Testing Service (ACT).

Part of the mission of the Division of Student Affairs is to identify the changing needs and interests of students and to share this information with the University community. Through this process we should be better able to assist students during their years at the University of Kansas.


## Who Are They?

Students at the University of Kansas represent a diverse population. Demographics and characteristics are recognized for the entire student body as well as for particular groups of students.

## General Demographics

### Total Enrollment

Enrollment on the Lawrence campus, which includes both on- and off-campus enrollments, has been increasing over the years and peaked in the fall of 1980 at 24,466 students. The last decade has seen a slowing in this increase with a leveling-off occurring at around 24,000 students:



## New Student Enrollment

After dramatic increases in the sixties and early seventies, the number of students enrolling at KU for the first time has stabilized at approximately 25% of the total fall enrollment. However, while the number of transfer and new graduate students has declined, the number of first-time enrolled freshman runs counter to declining numbers of high school seniors in Kansas and the national trend of decreasing numbers of high school graduates.

Once at KU, students choose a variety of living accommodations. The majority of students enrolled in the fall of 1984 lived in off-campus apartments or houses:

### Distribution by Age

In the fall of 1984, approximately 54% of all KU students were between the ages of 18 and 22. The largest age group of students was that of 20-year-olds. An additional 15% were aged 23 to 25.



The percentage of the student body that is over 25 years of age has generally increased over the last decade from roughly 24% to approximately 30%. The average (mean) age has shown a slight increase also. This is in accordance with the growth of nontraditional student enrollment. Nontraditional students are defined as students who are married, parents or veterans; who are employed full-time; or who are resuming their education after leaving school for a period of time, most of whom tend to be older than the typical 18 to 22 year old student:

### Credit Hour Distribution

From 1978 to the present, the percentage of part-time students has been determined on the basis of less than 12 hours for undergraduates and law students and less than 9 hours for graduate students. Prior to this, part-time status for all levels was figured on the basis of students enrolled in 6 hours or less. Given this difference in formulas, the percentage of students enrolled full-time has remained fairly steady over the last decade. In the fall of 1984, approximately 75% of the student body was enrolled with full-time status:

Almost half of the foreign students were undergraduates (48.0%), 47.8% were graduate students and 4.2% were enrolled at the Applied English Center. The percentage of foreign students who were men (68.5%) far exceeded the percentage of men found in the overall student body (52.2%).

## Transfer Students

As well as coming from a wide variety of foreign countries, students come to the University of Kansas from a number of higher education institutions across the United States and the state of Kansas. Of the students transferring to KU for the fall of 1984, 268 came from Missouri colleges, 852 from other out-of-state colleges, 566 from Kansas four year colleges, 684 from Kansas two year colleges, and 67 were from other schools in Kansas not identified as two year or four year colleges. ## Freshmen

The 1984 freshman class of 3,275 students is represented by 220 Kansas high schools, 95 Kansas counties and 41 states other than Kansas. Rockhurst (Missouri) and New Trier East (Illinois) high schools ranked first and second as out-of-state "feeder" high schools. Consistent with previous years, the top five Kansas "feeder" high schools are:

Freshmen begin classes at KU with a variety of preparatory backgrounds. A majority of incoming freshmen who took the ACT in 1984 reported having had extensive high school coursework in English and, to a lesser extent, mathematics. Freshmen appear to have the least amount of preparation for business and foreign languages.



The Fall enrollment of 17,021 includes 8,245 men (48.5%) and 8,776 women (51.5%).

The mean age of students is 27.6.

Some 3,161 are the age of 35 and over.

Married students number 6,128, or 36% of the student body.

Some 91.8% of WSU students are from Kansas.

"Evening" students now number 4,980 (29.3%).

"Working" students include 81.1% of the student body, and 9,994 students (58.7%) report working twenty hours a week or more.

It is expected that between 23,000-24,000 different students will enroll this year (Fall, Spring, Summer)

Over 5,895 students will receive financial assistance during the year, not including those receiving veterans benefits.

Veterans benefits will be extended to 837 students.

Some 2,035 minority students are enrolled.

Students occupy 6,128 rental units in the city.

Some 4,733 students live at home, while 5,211 report owning their own home.

The International student population is 1,071.



Members of Special Committee on Legislative Apportionment

I am Wanda Coder, Riley County Clerk. Thank you for the opportunity to appear before you today. Legislative apportionment is of concern to me for the following reasons:

K.S.U. Students

1985 records indicate 18,000 students attending K.S.U.

3500 students are living in Campus Resident Halls.  
900 live in Jardine Terrace married student housing.

The campus precinct includes the 3500 in resident halls and 900 in Jardine Terrace. Of this number, 728 registered and 540 voted in Riley County in the 1984 National & State Election.

13,600 off campus housing including Greek Housing.

Ft. Riley Reservation

1980 Federal Census figures list 15,192 on the Riley County/ Ft. Riley reservation. For voting purposes, this is a part of Madison Township. An average of 50 persons living on Ft. Riley reservation register & approximately 20 vote at one elction. I could not get permission from the Federal Government to establish a voting place on Ft. Riley reservation when military personnel were given the opportunity to vote in local elections.

Regardless of their permanent residence, when they live in Riley County, they are using Riley County services.

Riley County has 64,021 in 1986 population figures. Of this number, 18,000 are students and 15,192 military on Ft. Riley reservation.
