The State Conservation Commission supports SB-51 and has the following role in the Riparian and Wetlands Protection Program:

  - b. Fish and Game Commission
  - c. State and Extension Forestry
  - d. Soil Conservation Service
  - e. Division of Water Resources, State Board of Agriculture
  - f. Department of Health and Environment
  - g. Kansas Biological Survey
  - h. Kansas Water Office
- 2. DEVELOPMENT OF RULES AND REGULATIONS: These will provide standard guidelines for conservation districts and include:
  - a. Assignment of responsibilities
  - b. Development of district program
    - (1) Contents of district program
      - (a) Description of the resources
      - (b) Identification of specific problems and goals
        - 1. Background information
        - 2. Analysis and evaluation
        - 3. Establishment of priorities

- (c) Program plan requirements
  - 1. Technical assistance
  - 2. Financial assistance
  - 3. Educational program
- (d) Implementation
  - 1. Applicable local, state and federal programs
  - 2. Timetables to accomplish program goals
- (e) Monitoring and evaluation
- c. Provisions for public meeting before adoption of district program.
- GUIDANCE AND TRAINING: Provide assistance in the development and implmentation of district programs.
- 4. EVALUATION: Review and evaluation of district programs.

The State Conservation Commission also supports related SB-39, Stream Obstruction; SB-40, Environmental Coordination Act; SB-41, Minimum Desirable Stream Flow; and SB-42, Conservation Easements.
