The meeting was called to order by Chairman Crowell and the first order of business was a bill request.

Representatative George Teagarden introduced Mr. Lee Hodgson, LaCygne, Kansas.

Mr. Hodgson requested introduction of legislation which would repeal KSA 8-2503, Section (a) concerning the requirement that the front seat occupants of a passenger car wear seat belts. (See Attachment 1)

Mr. Hodgson said he believes it should be a choice of each individual whether or not to wear a seat belt, and presented signed petitions supporting the repeal of the statute. (See Attachment 2)

The next order of business was a hearing on HB-2101 concerning prisoner of war license plates.

Representative Kathleen Sebelius briefed the Committee on the bill, and explained HB-2101 provides for the surviving spouse of a prisoner of war to continue using the prisoner of war license plate. that the surviving spouse's right to use such a plate shall be terminated upon remarriage.

Representative Sebelius referred to a memorandum dated February 4, 1986, from the Kansas Department of Revenue which stated passage of this bill could reduce the State highway funds by \$9,000 in FY-1987. Attachment 3)

Dr. Carl J. Fyler, American Ex-Prisoner of War, Inc., testified in support of HB-2101. (See Attachment 4)

Mr. Raymond Weesart, Topeka, Kansas, presented favorable testimony concerning HB-2101. Mr. Weesart stated he was a prisoner of war during World War II, and urged the Committee to support this legislation.

The hearing on HB-2101 ended.

Attention was turned to the request for introduction of legislation which would repeal the seat belt law, made at the beginning of the meeting by Mr. Lee Hodgson.

A motion was made by Representative Laird that this legislation be introduced as a Committee bill. The motion was seconded by Representative Wilbert.

Committee discussion ensued.

The motion failed 10-6 on a division.



RE: Senate Bill 460,

FROM: Kansas Department of Revenue As Introduced

Brief of Bill: Senate Bill 460, as introduced, amends K.S.A. 1985 Supp. 8-177c.

This bill provides for the issuance of a "prisoner of war" license plate to the surviving spouse of a prisoner of war, upon submission of satisfactory proof, and only if the deceased prisoner had been issued a plate prior to death. The surviving spouse's right to such a plate shall be terminated upon remarriage.

<u>Fiscal Impact:</u> It is estimated that passage of this bill could reduce the State highway funds by \$9,000 in FY 1987. County collections could be reduced by an estimated \$1,000.

From the inception of the POW plate, January 1, 1984, through January 21, 1986, there have been 582 POW plates issued. Assuming that surviving spouses will choose to keep these plates upon the death of the POW, and that POW registrations are distributed by vehicle weight in the same proportion as general registrations, the impact is:

INFORMATION FOR WIVES: RE: AUTOPSY OF EX-POW compiled by Phyllis Schroeder, R.N.

THE RECORDS NOTE A HIGH PERCENTAGE OF DEATHS FOR EX-POW'S IN THE FIRST FEW YEARS AFTER RELEASE, THEN THE RATE SLOWS BUT IS EXPECTED TO INCREASE WITH AGE. BUT IS ALWAYS HIGHER THAN FOR NON POW-RATE. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THE LIFE SPAN IS SHORTENED FOUR YEARS FOR EVERY YEAR SPENT AS A POW. WOMEN HAVE A LONGER LIFE SPAN THAN MEN WHICH LEAVES US WITH A POTENTIAL FOR OUTLIVING OUR SPOUSES. VERIFYING THAT HIS DEATH WAS RELATED TO HIS INTERNMENT IS ONE OF OUR RESPONSIBILITIES. AUTOPSY AND DEATH ARE SUBJECTS NO ONE WANTS TO CONSIDER. DEATH IS A NATURAL PART OF LIVING. THERE IS A TIME TO BE BORN AND A TIME TO DIE. ONE OF OUR CONCERNS IS RELATING THE DEATH TO THE STRESSES OF INTERNMENT.

AN INTENSIVE AUTOPSY IS AN ESSENTIAL PORTION OF DOCUMENTING EARLY DEATH TO POW INTERNMENT. THE SPECIFICS THAT TELL THE STORY ARE NOT FOUND ON A ROUTINE AUTOPSY. INTERVIEWING PATHOLOGISTS IN A VARIETY OF INSTITUTIONS AND AREAS, REVEALED JUST ROUTINE AUTOPSIES WERE PERFORMED ON EX-POW'S UNLESS REQUESTS FOR SPECIFIC STUDIES WERE RECEIVED. THE OBVIOUS IS THAT ALL PATHOLOGISTS OR OTHERS DOING AUTOPSIES MUST BE INFORMED OF THE SPECIFICS REQUIRED TO ESTABLISH THE RELATIONSHIP OF DEATH TO PROLONGED MALNUTRITION OR INTERNMENT.

I WOULD LIKE TO SEE AN AUTOSPY PERFORMED ON ALL EX-POW'S AND THESE FINDINGS ADDITION-ALLY USED TO FURTHER THE RESEARCH BEING DONE BY MEDSEARCH. THE CONCERN AND SUPPORT OF COMRADES FOR EACH OTHER THAT ENABLED THOSE WHO RETURNED TO SURVIVE THE ATROCITIES OF INTERNMENT WOULD BE CONTINUED BY US IN THIS FINAL PHASE OF THEIR LIVES TO INCREASE THE KNOWLEDGE OF AFTER-EFFECTS OF IMPRISONMENT FOR ALL POW'S.

H.P. GREELY'S "BERIBERI HEART DISEASE" STATES, "PATHOLOGICALLY, THERE ARE NO ISOLATED SPECIFIC FEATURES, BUT THE COMPOSITE PATTERN...CAN YIELD STRONGLY SUPPORTIVE EVIDENCE FOR BERIBERI. SHORT OF POST-MORTEM EXAMINATION THE DIAGNOSIS OF BERIBERI HEART IS OFTEN SPECULATIVE."

MANSON'S TROPICAL DISEASES 1972 STATES UNDER BERIBERI, "THOSE SYSTEMS OF THE BODY WHICH UTILIZE CARBOHYDRATES ARE MOST RAPIDLY AFFECTED. THESE ARE THE CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM, PERIPHERAL NERVES AND THE CARDIAC MUSCLE."

THE AFTEREFFECTS OF INCARCERATION - MEDICAL FACTS

We suffered from brutal and inhumane treatment, beatings, torture, slave labor and starvation.

Many of us lost from 40 to 60% of our body weight for a prolonged period of time. Medical experts agree this causes irreversible damage to all body systems and

We suffered from a multipicity of deficiencies and infective diseases for a prolong period of time without adequate medication (in many cases, none). This also leads to many serious medical problems later in life.

American deaths in POW camps: 37.2% in the Pacific, 39% in Korea.

Extreme Stress: We lived under the constant fear of torture and death, never knowing where they would behead us or shoot us.

As a result of this we suffer from the KZ Syndrome (German for Concentration Camp). The KZ Syndrome consists of:

- 1. Failing memory and difficulty in concentration
- 2. Nervousness, irritability, restlessness
- 3. Fatigue
- 4. Traumatic dreams
- 5. Headaches
- 6. Depression
- 7. Moodiness
- 8. Loss of initative
- 9. A feeling of insufficiency
- Many of us shun large crowds and social activities.

In the past 16 years of research we have found that the ex-pow's suffer from premature aging - while one year in war ages a man as much as 2 years of peace, a year in a prisoner of war camp puts at least 4 years on his age.

Since repatriation Morbidity Studies have shown that POW's have a higher incidence rate of illness and disease in all body systems. These studies have also shown that the greater the degree of malnutrition, the greater the likelihood of illness and disease. For all POW's the incident rate of psychological impairment has been considerably greater. Repatriated POW's in general have more frequent need for hospitalization and care and tend to remain longer than their matched comparison groups. (Ref. Beebe, G.M., Nat'l Academy of Science, Washington, D.C., 1975)

Mortality rate of ex-POW's: For 2 years after repatrition the death rate was 50% higher than the normal population for Japanese POW's and persisted higher for 9 years. For Korean POW's the death rate was 40% higher than the normal population for 2 years and persisted higher for 13 years. For European POW's the death rate was higher in the 7th and again about the 18th year after being repatriated. An excess of deaths due to cirrhosis of the liver in all three former prisoner groups appeared from about the 10th follow-up year. (Ref. Keehn, R.J., Nat'l Academy of Science Washington, D.C. 1976.)

During my years of researching the after effects of imprisonment the Marshfield Clinic, Marshfield, WI with its staff of 200 physicians and the Marshfield Medical Foundation have given me invaluable assistance. They always stand ready to help me regardless of what I need.

DEAR DR. STENGER:

...During W.W.II. I served with the 82nd Airborne Division and was taken prisoner during the "Battle of the Bulge" on Christmas night in 1944. ... I always refer to my own imprisonment as 100 days. During that 100 days (not 6 months) I lost the equivalent of one pound per one day. Upon my liberation and subsequent return to the States, I had gone from a weight of 165 pounds to 64 pounds. ... Perhaps you can use this photo (and letter) to convince any one who doubts the fact, that the time of imprisonment is totally irrelevant to the treatment, or conditions, and the physical condition of any soldier, (in any war), who was a prisoner of the enemy. Please feel free to use this picture in any way you see fit, to further the cause of the American Ex-P.O.W.'s.

66-525. Railroad right-of-way; abandonment, when; requirements; release; notice. (a) For purposes of this section, a railroad right-of-way shall be considered abandoned when the tracks, ties, and other components necessary for operation of the rail line are removed from the right-of-way following the issuance of an abandonment order by the appropriate federal or state authority; or if, within two years after the exercise of such an order, removal of such components is not completed and railroad operating authority is not restored or reissued by an appropriate court or other federal or state authority; or if no rail line is placed on the right-of-way within 10 years after the right-of-way is acquired; except, that a railroad right-of-way shall not be considered abandoned if the railroad company or any other entity continues gail operations even the right-of-way after abandonment authority has been issued.

(b) If the grantee or assignee of record of a recorded railroad right-of-way abandons such right-of-way, such grantee or assignee, within 180 days after being requested by any owner of property servient to the right-of-way, shall file a release of all right, title and interest in the right-of-way with the register of deeds of the counties in which

the property is located.

(c) If a grantee or assignee of record of a railroad right-of-way refuses or neglects to file a release when required by subsection (b), the owner of the servient property may bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to recover from the grantee or assignee of record damages in the amount of \$500, together with costs and reasonable attorney fees for preparing and prosecuting the action. The owner may recover such additional damages as the evidence warrants, and may obtain injunctive relief to quiet the title and eject any unauthorized parties from the property.

(d) A grantee or assignee of railroad right-of-way, at any time, may file a general release of all right, title and interest in the right-of-way of one or more particular rail lines or portions thereof with the register of deeds of the county or counties in which such property is located. If such action has been taken, the grantee or assignee shall be relieved of any further obligation under this section to file individual releases of any right-of-way included in such a general re-

lease.

(e) Vithin 30 days after entering abandoned railroad right-of-way property upon the tax rolls pursuant to K.S.A. 79-401 et seq., and amendments thereto, the county clerk of each county in which such property is so entered shall forward to the most recent railroad company holder of such property for right-of-way purposes, a certified list of the names and addresses of all property owners so entered upon the tax rolls

following abandonment. Within 30 days after receipt of such certified list by the railroad company, it shall send a notice of abandonment by first-class mail to each landowner at the address provided. The grantee or assignee of record of a recorded railroad right-of-way who abandons such right-of-way and provides the notice of such abandonment required by this subsection shall incur no civil or criminal liability for failure to notify any person who claims, or may claim, ownership of property servient to the abandoned rightof-way, nor shall such grantee or assignee incur any civil or criminal liability for notifying any person who has no legal claim to ownership of property servient to the abandoned right-of-way. The notice required by this subsection shall not create any legal right, be construed as a warranty or guarantee, nor shall such notice impair or cloud any lawful claim, right, title or interest of any person.

(f) Any conveyance by any railroad company of any actual or purported right, title or interest in right-of-way held by such railroad company for railroad uses and purposed to any party other than the owner of the servient estate shall be null and void, unless such conveyance is made with a manifestation of intent that the railroad company's successor shall maintain railroad operations on such right-of-way, and the railroad owns marketable title for such pur-

pose.

(g) As used in this section, "railroad company" has the meaning of such term as defined in K.S.A. 66-180, and amendments thereto.

The Department of Revenue respectfully requests that the House Committee on Transportation introduce legislation in accordance with the following recommendations. The requested bills are summarized only briefly here; complete explanations will, of course, be provided when the Committee hears the bills.

A. Vehicle Salesperson Licensing (K.S.A. 8-2404(d))

Current law provides that vehicle salesperson licenses expire on December 31 of each year. This is the same date that vehicle dealership licenses expire. We recommend changing the expiration date of salespersons licenses to June 30 to even out the work load in the Dealers Licensing Bureau. In the transition year, licenses would be issued January 1, 1987 and expire June 30, 1988.

B. License vs. Number Plates (K.S.A. 8-143b, 8-143f, 8-143h, 8-145a, 8-145b, 8-145c)

These statutes refer to "number plates". With the implementation of SAM123 these statutes need to be amended to reflect the change from "number plates" to "license plates". We recommend the changes.

C. Requirements for Yearly Registration Decals (K.S.A. 8-134)

Current law provides that the yearly registration decals be identified as to the county in which they were issued and that they be numbered serially in each county. This has the effect of complicating the process of manufacturing the decals and requiring the printing and maintenance of 105 separate inventories of decals. These requirements do not add appreciably to the security of the decals.

We recommend that KSA 8-134 be amended to (1) delete the requirement of having the county designated on the decal and (2) revise the requirement that the decals be numbered serially in each county to just being numbered serially. Effective date should be January 1, 1988. This change would enable the division to have one set of a particular decal and not one set for each county. The decals would be numbered serially statewide.

D. Funding for Vehicle Information Processing System.

It has always been intended that the Vehicle Information Processing System (VIPS) project being developed by the department would be paid for by an increase in a vehicle-related fee. VIPS is an overhaul of the automated and manual systems used to process vehicle title and registration transactions. The basic construct of the system is that all transactions will be entered into a computer system at the County Treasurer's office and updated via telecommunications to the State computer system on an overnight basis. The system will provide quicker, more efficient and more accurate vehicle transactions.

VIPS is designed to operate on the same computer system that has been installed in the counties for reappraisal. To encourage counties to purchase compatible computers and to purchase computers large enough to handle VIPS and reappraisal, the Department proposed to the counties that, **dependent on legislative authorization**, if they purchased a processor large enough to handle VIPS and reappraisal and if at the time we installed VIPS there was still sufficient room to handle VIPS, we would reimburse them the cost of the central processor. This proposal was made to insure compatibility, maximize our ability to support the two applications, and reduce total state and local costs for VIPS and reappraisal. All 100 counties which are eligible have agreed to the program, and the combined costs are about \$1 million less than would be incurred for separate systems over a five year period.

A phased implementation of VIPS will begin in FY 1988 and be completed by the end of FY 1989. It is therefore necessary to generate the revenues to pay for the system. Otherwise, the expenditures, assuming they are approved, will simply come from the State Highway Fund. We recommend that the fee for issuance of an original or duplicate title be increased from \$3.50 to \$9.00 per title as a means of financing VIPS. With an effective date of July 1, 1987, the fee increase will generate about \$8.8 million over a two year period, compared to projected costs of \$8.2 million for VIPS and the reimbursement of county costs for the purchase of the processors.

E. Collection of Vehicle Fees (K.S.A. 8-145)

There are a limited number of instances in which current statutes do not enable the division to collect all fees due. Also VIPS is predicated on the use of Electronic Funds Transfers between County Treasurer offices and the State Treasury, a system which is not envisioned in current law. To accomplish this, we recommend this statute be amended to: (1) enable the collection of additional title and registration fees not collected at the time of application to be collected the next year by the Division of Vehicles when the individual registers the vehicle; (2) enable the Division of Vehicles to suspend the registrations of those vehicles in which the owner refuses to remit the additional fees due; and (3) enable the Secretary of Revenue, at the direction of the Pooled Money Investment Board, to establish state bank accounts in the county for direct daily deposit of fees collected with electronic funds transfer to the State Treasurer. Effective date of January 1, 1988.

AN ACT designating Interstate highway 670 as the Jay Dillingham memorial highway.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. Interstate highway 670 where it enters the state on the Kansas-Missouri line on the east, thence west to the junction with Interstate highway 70, is hereby designated as the Jay Dillingham memorial highway. The secretary of transportation shall place markers along the highway right-of-way at proper intervals to indicate that the highway is the Jay Dillingham memorial highway. The secretary of transportation may accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in obtaining suitable highway signs bearing the proper approved inscription.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
