Senator Gordon made a motion the minutes of February 11, 12, 18 and 19 be approved. Senator Doyen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The Vice-Chairman called attention to SCR 1604 and called on Mr. Leonard to testify.

Mr. Leonard gave copies of his testimony to the Committee ( $\underline{\text{attachment 1}}$ ); he expressed support for SCR 1604 and also support for its passage by the Committee.

During discussion the Committee discussed whether the resolution pertained to all grains or just wheat. The decision reached was that the resolution pertained to all grains. It was discussed who the resolution should be sent to and who should deliver the copies of the resolution. It was pointed out that the purpose of this resolution was to give something in writing for Dr. Charles Deyoe, Director of the International Grains Program, to have in hand to present to other states or grain commissions to show that Kansas feels others should help support the International Grains Program. The Committee agreed that conversations should be held with Dr. Deyoe to determine an amount of money that should be paid to Kansas in support of the International Grains Program by other states/grains organizations.

Senator Gannon made a conceptional motion to amend the SCR 1604 Resolution to be sent to the International Grains Program, Grains Sorghum Commission, Corn Commission, Soybean Commission and the Wheat Commission and for them to give copies of the resolutions to ones that these groups feel should be helping support the International Grains Program. Senator Doyen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator Karr made a motion the Committee recommend passage of SCR 1604 as amended. Senator Gannon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator Montgomery turned Committee attention to SB 74.

Senator Warren made a motion the Committee amend SB 74 on line 71 by adding the words 'private applicator' after the word 'for' and before 'certification'. Senator Gordon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator Warren made a motion the Committee recommend SB 74 favorably for passage as amended. Senator Kerr seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Vice-Chairman Montgomery adjourned the Committee at 10:30 a.m.
