- 3. review of the marketing efforts of the Kansas State Board of Agriculture;
- 4. study the duties and functions of the Grain Inspection Department;
- 5. review the duties and functions of the Kansas Wheat Commission including its funding;
- 6. study the possible consolidation of the International Grains Program and the International Meat and Livestock Program; and
- 7. study the Kansas Corporate Farming Law to determine the impact of permitting more corporate involvement in Kansas agriculture.
