This bill is the result of Proposal 26. Most of the changes are clean-up in terminology and clarification. The task force and committee recommended that coroners consent to removal of a body part if such body part is not necessary in the determination of cause and circumstances of death.

SB-20 - An Act concerning the uniform anatomical gift act;

This bill deleted "licensed, accredited, or approved under the laws of any state" as our state nor other states have such a law.

SB-21 - An Act concerning the human body; declaring certain acts relating to the buying or selling of a human body or part thereof to be unlawful and classifying the crime and the penalties for violations.

This bill is a new piece of legislation which makes it a crime to knowingly buy, sell or offer to buy or sell or counsel others in buying or selling or offering to buy or sell a human body or part of a human body including but not limited to transplantation, implantation, infusion, injection or other medical or scientific purposes.

SB-12 - An Act concerning medical assistance: relating to determination of elgibility; concerning recovery of medical assistance paid;

This bill was developed subsequent to Proposal 17 and is related to <u>SB-13</u>. Initially the Alzheimer's Task Force was the moving force in this area. <u>SB-12</u> relates to a division of resources between spouses. Staff stated that changes would need to be made as this bill was worked.

SB-13 - An Act concerning medical assistance; relating to determination of elgibility; concerning recovery of medical assistance paid;

This bill was developed subsequent to Proposal 17 and deals with division of income between spouses. This is a companion bill of $\underline{SB-12}$. Staff stated changes would need to be made during the consideration of this bill. This is an income protection type of act.

SB-18 - An Act concerning human body parts; declaring certain acts relating thereto not to be a sale and limiting liability therefor;

This bill relates to the current law relating to the fact that furnishing or donating any human body part is not a sale and no warranties may be attached. This would protect from suit against those individuals furnishing human body parts based upon contract relationships.
