HB 2272 - FY 1988 Appropriations for general government (Continued)

Senator Winter reviewed the Subcommittee Report relating to FY 1987, HB 2395, FY 1988, HB 2272, for the Department of Human Resources and the Department of Commerce. Senator Gannon moved, Senator Doyen seconded, the removal of 2 FTE positions, amounting to $\frac{\$121,859}{\$121,859}$, from the budget pertaining to the Department of Commerce for International Trade. Senator Gannon explained that he would try to pursuade the Committee to provide the appropriate funding within the Department of Agriculture. Following discussion, the motion failed. Senator Kerr moved, Senator Talkington seconded, to amend the Subcommittee Report regarding HB 2272, Department of Commerce, by creating a separate item for special projects in the amount of \$250,000 to be funded from the State General Fund for the proposed federal particle accelerator project. The motion carried by voice vote.

Senator Winter continued review of HB 2272. In regard to the Kansas Commission on Veteran's Affairs, Senator Feleciano moved for the restoration of one FTE veteran's service representative position in the amount of \$19,760. Senator Gaines seconded the motion. The motion failed. Senator Winter made a motion to amend the Subcommittee Report to allow the Commission the flexibility to choose what positions they restore within the proposed addition in FY 1988 of \$31,784 by the Senate Subcommittee recommendation. Senator Werts seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote.

Senator Winter moved, Senator Werts seconded, the adoption of the Subcommittee Report regarding HB 2395, Sections 2, 3, 5, 10, 11, and 21 and HB 2272, Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17, as amended. The motion carried by voice vote. Senator Winter moved, Senator Werts seconded, to report HB 2272 favorably for passage as amended. The motion passed upon a roll call vote.

SB 373 - Construction defects recovery fund; expenditures over \$25,000; approval by attorney general, when.

Staff reviewed <u>SB 373</u> and <u>Senator Werts moved</u>, <u>Senator Johnston seconded</u>, <u>recommending SB373 favorably for passage</u>. The motion passed on a roll call vote.

SB 374 - Increased reimbursement for local agencies providing food service inspections.

<u>Senator Gaines moved, Senator Werts seconded, recommending SB 374 favorably for passage.</u> The motion carried by roll call vote.

SB 392 - Kansas technical institute authorized to purchase aircraft for purposes of renovation.

Mr. Jim Friesen, Director of Operational Affairs, Kansas Technical Institute, spoke in favor of \underline{SB} 392 following staff review. Mr. Friesen pointed out that KTI is unique in that they are the only state agency which purchases aircraft for renovation and use in their aeronautical techology program. The difficulty they experience in purchasing this aircraft tis that the vendors selling the aircraft do not wich to wait the 45 days for receipt of their money. If someone else offers funds during this period of time, the vendor will sell the aircraft to that purchases. He cited examples and noted he had documentation. Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Johnston seconded, reporting SB 392 favorably for passage. On a roll call vote, the motion carried.
