Staff reviewed $\underline{\text{HB }2377}$ and $\underline{\text{Senator Gaines moved}}$, $\underline{\text{Senator Gannon seconded}}$, $\underline{\text{to report HB }2377}$ favorably for passage. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

 $\frac{\mathrm{HB}\ 2411}{\mathrm{board}}$ - Retirement annuities for officers and employees of the state

Staff distributed and reviewed a balloon draft of $\underline{\text{HB 2411}}$ containing proposed amendments for consideration by the Committee. (Attachment 1)

Ted Ayres, General Council, Board of Regents, distributed testimony from Richard L. Mann, University of Kansas regarding HB 2411. (Attachment 2) Mr. Ayres stated that he was unable to address the bill with the proposed amendments so his remarks would be directed to the bill in general. He stated that the Board of Regents does support a clarification of the bill. It would be the recommendation of the Board that the initial two year waiting period be reduced to one year. He pointed out that the word, "public" in the balloon language on line 0038 creates a question as to whether it would make it impossible to recruit from private institutions. Mr. Ayres stated that the Board would recommend the employer contribution to KPERS be required for one year, rather than the six months as amended by the House Committee on Pensions, Investments and Benefits. He stated that the Board would rather have the six month contribution than the one year requirement.

Following discussion, Senator Gaines moved, Senator Feleciano seconded, amending HB 2411 to reflect a one year waiting period, line 0034 and other appropriate lines. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Winter seconded, striking the word, "public" in from of "institution of higher education" throughout the inserted language throughout the balloon draft of HB 2411. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Senator Gaines moved, Senator Feleciano seconded, approval of the amendments proposed in the balloon draft of HB 2411 as outlined in Attachment 1 4/3/87 (a). The motion carried on a voice vote.

Senator Gaines moved, Senator Winter seconded, to recommend HB 2411, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion passed on a roll call vote.

Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Winter seconded, the introduction of bill draft 7 RS 1425, an act concerning a claim against the state; authorizing

Section 1. K.S.A. 1986 Supp. 74-4925 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-4925. (1) The state board of regents shall: (a) Assist all those members of the faculty and other persons who are employed by the state board of regents or by educational institutions under its management and who are in the unclassified service under the Kansas civil service act as provided in subsection (1)(f) of K.S.A. 75-2935 and amendments thereto, in 0031 the purchase of retirement annuities for their service rendered after December 31, 1961. TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL 2411 RICHARD L. MANN UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS APRIL 2, 1987

I am here today to testify concerning H.B. 2411 and to enlist your support in amending the bill. As it is currently drafted, the bill could create severe problems for the University of Kansas and the other Regents institutions. The bill governs the unclassified and faculty basic retirement program and specifically addresses the waiting period which new employees coming into the Regents system would have to observe before becoming members of the basic retirement program. As drafted, the bill requires that a faculty member or unclassified employee coming to a Regents institution will have to wait two years before participating in the basic retirement program. Only those individuals who were enrolled in their prior institution's pension program under one of the four companies currently providing the Regents pension plan (TIAA/CREF, Aetna, Lincoln National, or Union Mutual) would be allowed to participate immediately in the Regents program.

Our concern is that recruitment of experienced faculty and unclassified personnel will be severely hurt by this requirement. Many universities do not have retirement plans with the companies under the Board of Regents pension program. For example, the University of Illinois, the University of California and the University of Texas pension plans are with other companies or are state-operated. In addition, we also recruit large numbers of people from industry and government who will not have participated in pensions plans with the four companies and they, too, would be subject

to the 2-year waiting period. Most other universities require, at most, a one-year waiting period.

As you can see, we believe this bill would seriously injure our recruiting efforts. We would appreciate an amendment of the bill to allow individuals who are vested in any valid pension program immediately prior to coming to a Regents institution to participate immediately in the Regents retirement program. In addition, we request that the waiting period be reduced to one year, consistent with the KPERS waiting period and consistent with the waiting period at most other universities. Finally, we ask that line 0057 be amended to make clear that the reference is to the voluntary tax sheltered annuity plan offered by the Regents. This voluntary program is offered in addition to the Regents basic retirement program.
