
0027 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. The legislature, in recognition of the searcity of state resources, hereby declares that the provision of economic development incentives should be limited to those enterprises which are basic to the economic structure of this state and which 0032 have the greatest potential for effecting economic growth that is 0033 essential to the well being of the state and its people. Therefore, 0034 it is the intention of this act to provide a means of identifying 0035 those enterprises which qualify as Kansas basic enterprises.
